3 (a) (1) This subsection applies to a person engaged in the business of selling
4 prescription drugs, controlled dangerous substances, medicines, chemicals, or
5 preparations for medical use or of compounding or dispensing these in accordance
6 with physicians' prescriptions.

7 (2) A person subject to this subsection may not knowingly sell or deliver 8 to another a drug, medicine, chemical, or preparation for medicinal use that is 9 recognized or authorized by the latest edition of the United States Pharmacopoeia 10 and National Formulary or prepared according to the private formula of another that 11 is:

15(ii)except as authorized under § 12-504 of the Health Occupations16Article, called for in a prescription of a physician or other authorized provider.
