1 AN ACT concerning

**2 Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2004 - Maryland Independent College and University Association -
Columbia Union College**

3 FOR the purpose of amending the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2004 to authorize the grant to be used for the design and construction of a new music education building; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2004 and Columbia Union College.

4 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
5 Chapter 432 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2004
6 Section 1(3) Item ZA00 (G)

7 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That:

11 ZA00 MISCELLANEOUS GRANT PROGRAMS

12 (G) Maryland Independent College and University Association - Columbia
13 Union College. Provide a grant equal to the lesser of (i) \$2,250,000 or
14 (ii) the amount of the matching fund provided, to the Board of Trustees
15 of Columbia Union College to assist in the design and construction of a
16 new [library] MUSIC EDUCATION BUILDING, subject to the
17 requirement that the grantee provide an equal and matching fund for
18 this purpose. Notwithstanding Section 1(5) of this Act, the matching
19 fund may consist of funds expended prior to the effective date of this
20 Act (Montgomery County)2,250,000

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a ye and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
