2 **Family Law - Foster Care - Payment Rates**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the rate of payment for foster care in a single family  
4 home; authorizing certain adjustments to that rate; requiring the Governor to  
5 include in the State budget certain funding for the payment for foster care in  
6 single family homes for certain fiscal years; and generally relating to payment  
7 for foster care in a single family home.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article - Family Law**

16 5-527.

17 (a) The Department shall adopt rules and regulations that establish eligibility  
18 guidelines for payment for foster care for 1 or more classes of children, including  
19 children who are in need of special care.

20 (b) (1) [For] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION,  
21 FOR a child who does not need special care, the Department shall pay for foster care  
22 in a single family home at a monthly rate that is not less than [55% of the monthly  
23 rate provided in subsection (c) of this section for a child who requires the most

1 demanding special care in a single family home] THE AMOUNT REPORTED ANNUALLY  
2 BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AS THE ESTIMATED  
3 AVERAGE ANNUAL EXPENDITURE ON A CHILD AT LEAST 9 YEARS OLD AND UNDER  
4 THE AGE OF 11 IN THE MIDDLE INCOME FAMILY BRACKET IN THE URBAN SOUTH, AS  
5 ADJUSTED ANNUALLY.

6 (2) The monthly rate [shall include increments] MAY BE INCREASED  
7 based on:

8 (I) the age of the child; AND

9 (II) THE NEED FOR EXTRA CARE AND SUPERVISION BECAUSE OF  
10 THE SPECIAL PHYSICAL, EMOTIONAL, OR BEHAVIORAL NEEDS OF THE CHILD.

11 [(c) The Department shall pay for foster care for a child who needs the most  
12 demanding special care in a single family home at a monthly rate that is not less than

14 (1) the rate that the Department paid in fiscal year 1975; and

15 (2) the rate that the Department of Juvenile Services pays for the  
16 current fiscal year.]

17 (C) THE GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE IN THE STATE BUDGET SUFFICIENT  
18 FUNDING TO PROVIDE FOR THE FOLLOWING PERCENTAGES OF THE RATE

20 (1) 75% IN FISCAL YEAR 2008;

21 (2) 85% IN FISCAL YEAR 2009;

23 (4) 100% IN FISCAL YEAR 2011 AND THEREAFTER.
