A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Procurement - Small Business Reserve Program - Disabled Veteran-Owned**
3 **Small Businesses**

4 FOR the purpose of establishing a percentage price preference for small businesses
5 that are a certain percentage owned and controlled by one or more disabled
6 veterans; providing that a certain percentage price preference may not be used
7 in conjunction with certain other percentage price preferences; altering the
8 termination date of the Small Business Reserve Program; defining certain
9 terms; providing for the termination of certain provisions of this Act; and
10 generally relating to the Small Business Reserve Program.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 **Article - State Finance and Procurement**

22 14-502.1.

23 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
24 INDICATED.

1 (2) "DISABLED VETERAN" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS SERVED IN
2 ONE OR MORE OF THE UNITED STATES UNIFORMED SERVICES AND HAS BEEN
3 CERTIFIED EITHER BY THE SERVICE OR THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS
4 AFFAIRS AS HAVING A SERVICE-CONNECTED DISABILITY REGARDLESS OF THE
5 DISABILITY RATING AND WHO IS DOMICILED IN THE STATE.

6 (3) "DISABLED VETERAN-OWNED SMALL BUSINESS" MEANS A SMALL
7 BUSINESS THAT IS AT LEAST 51% OWNED AND CONTROLLED BY ONE OR MORE
8 INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE DISABLED VETERANS.

9 (4) "PERCENTAGE PRICE PREFERENCE" MEANS THE PERCENT BY WHICH
10 A RESPONSIVE BID FROM A RESPONSIBLE BIDDER THAT IS A DISABLED
11 VETERAN-OWNED SMALL BUSINESS MAY EXCEED THE LOWEST BID FROM A
12 RESPONSIBLE BIDDER THAT IS NOT A DISABLED VETERAN-OWNED SMALL
13 BUSINESS.

14 (B) EACH DESIGNATED PROCUREMENT UNIT SHALL ESTABLISH A PRICE
15 PREFERENCE OF 10% FOR THE PROCUREMENT OF GOODS, SUPPLIES, MAINTENANCE,
16 CONSTRUCTION, CONSTRUCTION-RELATED SERVICES, ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES,
17 AND ENGINEERING SERVICES DESIGNATED FOR THE SMALL BUSINESS RESERVE
18 UNDER THIS SUBTITLE FROM A DISABLED VETERAN-OWNED SMALL BUSINESS.

19 (C) A PERCENTAGE PRICE PREFERENCE UNDER THIS SECTION MAY NOT BE
20 USED IN CONJUNCTION WITH ANY OTHER PERCENTAGE PRICE PREFERENCE
21 ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS TITLE.

22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland
23 read as follows:

Chapter 75 of the Acts of 2004

25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
26 effect October 1, 2004. It shall remain effective for a period of [3] 7 years and, at the
27 end of September 30, [2007] 2011, with no further action required by the General
28 Assembly, this Act, and any regulations adopted under the provisions of this Act, shall
29 be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

30 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
31 October 1, 2006. Section 1 of this Act shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and,
32 at the end of September 30, 2011, with no further action required by the General
33 Assembly, Section 1 of this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
