The new death benefit established by this Act shall be paid to the surviving spouse, child, dependent parent, or estate of the law enforcement officer, correctional officer, full-time employee of a State correctional facility, full-time State parole and probation officer, volunteer or career firefighter or rescue squad member, or sworn member of the office of State Fire Marshal killed on or after July 1, 2006. The death benefit paid to the surviving spouse, child, dependent parent, or estate of a law enforcement officer, correctional officer, volunteer or career firefighter or rescue squad member, or sworn member of the office of State Fire Marshal who died on or after July 1, 1989, but before July 1, 2006, is the benefit provided under State law as
