Prescription Drug Repository Program

FOR the purpose of establishing a Prescription Drug Repository Program regulated 3 by the State Board of Pharmacy; providing for the purpose of the Program; 4 5 authorizing the Program to accept, for the purpose of dispensing, only certain prescription drugs and medical supplies under certain conditions; prohibiting 6 the Program from accepting, for dispensing purposes, certain prescription drugs 7 8 or medical supplies; providing that any person may donate prescription drugs or 9 medical supplies to the Program at certain drop-off sites; requiring a designated 10 drop-off site to meet certain requirements; prohibiting a designated drop-off site from taking certain actions; authorizing the Board to approve certain 11 12 pharmacies to be repositories; requiring a repository to meet certain 13 requirements; authorizing a repository to charge a fee, not to exceed a certain 14 amount, for each prescription drug or medical supply dispensed, and, subject to 15 a certain requirement, to dispense a prescription drug or medical supply by mail; prohibiting a repository from establishing or maintaining a certain 16 waiting list; establishing eligibility requirements for individuals to receive 17 donated drugs; prohibiting certain persons that act in good faith from being 18 19 subject to certain prosecution or liability for certain matters; requiring the 20 Board, on or before a certain date and in accordance with consideration of certain recommendations, to adopt regulations that include certain items; 21 22 requiring a repository to maintain certain records and submit certain reports; 23 requiring the Board to inspect designated drop-off sites and repositories, inspect 24 certain records, and report to the Governor and the General Assembly on the 25 operation of the Program; defining certain terms; and generally relating to a 26 Prescription Drug Repository Program.
