2 Marriage Amendment to the Constitution

- 3 FOR the purpose of adding a new section to the Maryland Constitution to establish
- 4 that marriage shall be between a man and a woman only; providing that the
- 5 right to establish certain unions between certain people shall be reserved to the
- 6 General Assembly and the people of Maryland; and submitting this amendment
- 7 to the qualified voters of the State of Maryland for their adoption or rejection.
- 8 BY proposing an addition to the Maryland Constitution
- 9 Article XV Miscellaneous
- 10 Section 8
- 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 12 MARYLAND, (Three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses
- 13 concurring), That it be proposed that the Maryland Constitution read as follows:
- 14 Article XV Miscellaneous
- 15 8.
- 16 (A) MARRIAGE SHALL BE BETWEEN A MAN AND A WOMAN ONLY.
- 17 (B) THE RIGHT TO ESTABLISH ANY OTHER CIVIL UNION BETWEEN TWO
- 18 PEOPLE IS RESERVED TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND THE PEOPLE OF MARYLAND.
- 19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly
- 20 determines that the amendment to the Maryland Constitution proposed by this Act
- 21 affects multiple jurisdictions and that the provisions of Article XIV, § 1 of the
- 22 Maryland Constitution concerning local approval of constitutional amendments do
- 23 not apply.
- 24 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the aforegoing section
- 25 proposed as an amendment to the Maryland Constitution shall be submitted to the
- 26 legal and qualified voters of this State at the next general election to be held in
- 27 November, 2006 for their adoption or rejection in pursuance of directions contained in
- 28 Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution. At that general election, the vote on this

- 1 proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot2 there shall be printed the words "For the Constitutional Amendment" and "Against
- 3 the Constitutional Amendment," as now provided by law. Immediately after the
- 4 election, all returns shall be made to the Governor of the vote for and against the
- 5 proposed amendment, as directed by Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution, and
- 6 further proceedings had in accordance with Article XIV.
