Public Safety Employees Killed in Performance of Duties - Death Benefits

3 FOR the purpose of altering the amount of the death benefit for certain public safety

4 employees who are killed or die in the performance of duties on or after a certain

5 date; altering the fiscal year for which the death benefit shall be adjusted in a

6 certain manner; providing for a delayed effective date; and generally relating to

7 death benefits for public safety employees killed in the performance of duties.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

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1 (2) The funeral benefit under this subsection shall be reduced by the 2 amount of any related workers' compensation benefits paid under § 9-689 of the 3 Labor and Employment Article.

4 (e) (1) The Secretary of State shall issue a State flag to the family of a 5 firefighter, policeman, member of the military, or sworn member of the office of State 6 Fire Marshal who is killed in the performance of duty.

7 (2) (i) Except when the deceased is a member of the military, the flag
8 shall be presented to the family of the deceased by the State Senator of the legislative
9 district in which the deceased resided or served.

10 (ii) When the deceased is a member of the military, the flag shall be 11 presented to the family of the deceased by the Department of Veterans Affairs.

12 (f) On a case-by-case basis, the Secretary of Public Safety and Correctional
13 Services may award a death benefit under this section if:

14 (1) the decedent's death was caused by the decedent's intentional 15 misconduct;

16 (2) the decedent intended to bring about the decedent's death; or

17 (3) the decedent's voluntary intoxication was the proximate cause of the 18 decedent's death.

(g) If the Secretary of Public Safety and Correctional Services determines that20 the benefits under this section are to be paid, the benefits shall be paid:

21 (1) to the decedent's surviving spouse;

(2) if no individual is eligible under item (1) of this subsection, to eachsurviving child of the decedent in equal shares;

24 (3) (i) for a death benefit under subsection (b) of this section, if no 25 individual is eligible under item (1) or (2) of this subsection, to the decedent's

26 surviving parent, if the parent was a dependent as defined in § 152 of the Internal 27 Revenue Code: or

28 (ii) for any other benefit under this section, if no individual is 29 eligible under item (1) or (2) of this subsection, to the decedent's surviving parent; or

30 (4) if no individual is eligible under item (1), (2), or (3) of this subsection, 31 to the decedent's estate.

32 (h) Payments under this section shall be made out of money that the Governor33 includes for that purpose in the State budget.

34 (i) A person aggrieved by a final decision of the Secretary of Public Safety and
35 Correctional Services under this section may seek judicial review as provided for
36 review of final decisions in Title 10, Subtitle 2 of the State Government Article.
