- 3 FOR the purpose of urging all cell phone users to add the ICE (In Case of Emergency)
- 4 designation in their cell phone directories next to the names of individuals who
- 5 could provide vital information in time of crisis.
- 6 WHEREAS, The cell phone is an indispensable lifeline at times of crisis; and
- WHEREAS, When disaster strikes, the numbers stored in the address book of a
- 8 cell phone raise a problem for emergency services personnel trying to notify an
- 9 individual's next of kin because the emergency workers do not know which number to
- 10 call; and
- 11 WHEREAS, A simple initiative conceived by a paramedic in Britain to place the
- 12 acronym ICE (In Case of Emergency) before the names of next of kin in a cell phone's
- 13 address book began in April 2005; and
- WHEREAS, The ICE initiative has gained momentum since the bombings in
- 15 London in July 2005, when information about the plan spread by e-mail; and
- WHEREAS, Several next of kin contact systems were set up after the
- 17 September 11, 2001, attacks, but some charge as much as \$200 per year to register;
- 18 and
- 19 WHEREAS, The ICE initiative is available free to the 192,000,000 cell phone
- 20 users in the United States; and
- 21 WHEREAS, The cell phone industry welcomes this initiative; now, therefore, be
- 22 it
- 23 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That all cell
- 24 phone users should be urged to program the acronym ICE (In Case of Emergency)
- 25 next to the names of emergency contacts in the address books of their cell phone
- 26 directories and then to tell their ICE contacts that they have been identified as an
- 27 emergency contact; and be it further
