Family Law - Earnings Withholding - Notice of Change of Address or Employment

- 4 FOR the purpose of altering the manner in which an obligor subject to an earnings
- 5 withholding order is required to give notice of a change of address or
- 6 employment; altering the manner in which a recipient of support is required to
- 7 give notice of a change of address; specifying the time period within which notice
- 8 must be given; altering the contents of a certain statement required to be
- 9 included in certain orders and notices; and generally relating to earnings
- 10 withholding.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 21 immediate withholding under § 10-123 of this subtitle, that is passed on or after July

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1, 1985, and any notice and statement issued under subsection (b)(2) of this section2 shall include a statement that:

3 (1) if the obligor accumulates support payments arrears amounting to 4 more than 30 days of support, the obligor shall be subject to earnings withholding;

5 (2) SO LONG AS THE SUPPORT ORDER IS IN EFFECT, the obligor is 6 required to notify the court [within 10 days] of:

18 address [by certified mail, return receipt requested] to:
