2 **Family Law - Family Home or Family Use Personal Property - Termination**
3 **of Order or Decree**

4 FOR the purpose of altering the maximum duration of an order or decree concerning
5 a family home or family use personal property; providing for the application of
6 this Act; and generally relating to the termination of an order or decree
7 concerning a family home or family use personal property.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article - Family Law**

16 8-210.

17 (a) (1) In any order or decree, or any modification of an order or decree, a
18 provision that concerns the family home or family use personal property shall
19 terminate no later than [3] 5 years after the date on which the court grants an
20 annulment or a limited or absolute divorce.

1 (2) The [3-year] 5-YEAR limitation set out in paragraph (1) of this
2 subsection applies to a limited divorce notwithstanding the subsequent granting of an
3 absolute divorce.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be
5 construed to apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have
6 any effect on or application to any action for divorce or annulment filed before the
7 effective date of this Act.

8 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
9 October 1, 2006.
