In appointing the provider representatives of the provider review panel, the Board shall give consideration to providing for reasonable representation from throughout the State.

	(ii) A license or certificate may not lapse by operation of law while the holder of the license or certificate is under investigation or while charges are pending against the holder of the license or certificate.
	(4) The EMS Board may set conditions on its agreement with the holder of the license or certificate under investigation or against whom charges are pending to accept surrender of the license or certificate.

1 EMS Board to an individual who is licensed as a registered nurse or licensed practical 2 nurse. 3 (k) (1) The EMS Board may, over the signature of the chairman of the EMS 4 Board, Executive Director of the Institute, chairman of the provider review panel, or 5 State EMS Medical Director, issue subpoenas and administer oaths in connection 6 with any investigation under this section and any hearings or proceedings before it. 7 If, without lawful excuse, a person disobeys a subpoena of the EMS 8 Board or an order by the EMS Board to take an oath or to testify or answer a 9 question, a court of competent jurisdiction may punish the person for contempt. 10 If, after due notice, the individual against whom an action is 11 contemplated fails or refuses to appear, the EMS Board may hear and determine the 12 matter. 13 (4) If the entry is necessary to carry out a duty under this section, any 14 duly authorized agent or investigator of the EMS Board may enter at any reasonable 15 hour a place of business of a licensed or certified emergency medical services provider 16 or public premises. 17 The EMS Board may issue a cease and desist order or obtain 18 injunctive relief if a person provides emergency medical services without a license or 19 certificate. 20 (1) (1) A person who violates any provision of this subsection is guilty of a 21 misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or 22 imprisonment not exceeding 1 year or both. 23 (2) Unless licensed or certified to provide emergency medical services 24 under this section, a person may not represent to the public that the person is 25 authorized to provide emergency medical services in this State. 26 (3) Unless licensed or certified to provide emergency medical services 27 under this section, a person may not use the terms "cardiac rescue technician", 28 "CRT", "emergency medical dispatcher", "EMD", "emergency medical technician", 29 ["EMT-A",] "EMT-B", "EMT-P", "paramedic", or "first responder" or any other 30 words, letters, or symbols with the intent to represent that the person is authorized to 31 provide emergency medical services. 32 There is an EMS Board Provider Fund. (m) (1) 33 Except as provided in paragraph (3) of this subsection, the EMS 34 Board may set reasonable fees for the initial issuance of licenses or certificates and its 35 other services. 36 The EMS Board may not charge an initial licensing fee, an (3) (i) 37 initial certifying fee, a fee for the renewal of a license, a fee for the renewal of a 38 certificate, a testing fee, or a retesting fee to an individual who is a member or

Notice of any delegation of authority made under this section shall be 18 (2) 19 published in the Maryland Register. The EMS Board may not delegate its authority to promulgate and 20 21 revise regulations, hear contested cases, or designate the provider review panel to the 22 Executive Director of the Institute. 23 The EMS Board may delegate to the Office of Administrative (4) 24 Hearings the authority to hear contested cases and issue recommendations.
