13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

16 2-206.1.

17 (A) A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL THAT IS SUBJECT TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS
18 TITLE MAY NOT HIRE OR RETAIN ANY EMPLOYEE WHO WORKS WITH OR HAS ACCESS
19 TO STUDENTS AND WHO THE SCHOOL KNOWS HAS BEEN CONVICTED OF A CRIME
20 INVOLVING:

21 (1) AN OFFENSE UNDER § 3-307 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE;

(2) CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE UNDER § 3-602 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW
ARTICLE, OR AN OFFENSE UNDER THE LAWS OF ANOTHER STATE THAT WOULD
CONSTITUTE CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE UNDER § 3-602 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE
IF COMMITTED IN THIS STATE; OR

1 (3) A CRIME OF VIOLENCE AS DEFINED IN § 14-101 OF THE CRIMINAL 2 LAW ARTICLE, OR AN OFFENSE UNDER THE LAWS OF ANOTHER STATE THAT WOULD 3 BE A VIOLATION OF § 14-101 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE IF COMMITTED IN THIS 4 STATE.
