13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

17 (A) A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL THAT IS SUBJECT TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS
18 TITLE MAY NOT HIRE OR RETAIN ANY EMPLOYEE WHO WORKS WITH OR HAS ACCESS
19 TO STUDENTS AND WHO THE SCHOOL KNOWS HAS BEEN CONVICTED OF A CRIME

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 14 effect July 1, 2006.
