1 AN ACT concerning

Falsifying and Altering Permits, Licenses, and Certificates - Criminal Penalties

4 FOR the purpose of making it a misdemeanor, subject to certain penalties, to

- 5 knowingly falsify or make alterations to, alter, or cause another to falsify or alter
- 6 any permit, license, or certificate to demonstrate compliance with certain
- 7 environmental regulatory requirements; making it a misdemeanor, subject to
- 8 certain penalties, to knowingly possess or display <u>or submit to the Department</u>
- 9 of the Environment or any other person any falsified or altered permit, license,
- 10 or certificate to demonstrate compliance with certain environmental regulatory
- 11 requirements; requiring certain fines to be deposited into certain special funds;
- 12 requiring the Attorney General to take charge of, investigate, prosecute, and
- 13 defend on behalf of the State cases arising under this Act; providing for the
- 14 <u>construction of this Act;</u> and generally relating to criminal penalties for
- 15 falsifying or making alterations to documents required to demonstrate
- 16 compliance with certain environmental regulatory requirements.

3 (A) A PERSON WHO KNOWINGLY FALSIFIES OR, ALTERS, OR CAUSES ANOTHER
4 TO FALSIFY OR ALTER ANY PERMIT, LICENSE, OR CERTIFICATE ISSUED OR REQUIRED
5 PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE TO DEMONSTRATE COMPLIANCE WITH ANY
6 ENVIRONMENTAL REGULATION, PERMIT CONDITION, OR OTHER REGULATORY
7 REQUIREMENT UNDER THIS ARTICLE IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ON
8 CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO:

9 (1) FOR A FIRST OFFENSE, A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$25,000 OR 10 IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 1 YEAR OR BOTH; OR

11 (2) IF THE CONVICTION IS FOR A VIOLATION COMMITTED SUBSEQUENT
 12 TO A CONVICTION OF THE PERSON UNDER ANY SECTION OF THIS ARTICLE, A FINE
 13 NOT EXCEEDING \$50,000 FOR EACH VIOLATION OR IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 2
 14 YEARS OR BOTH.

(B) A PERSON WHO KNOWINGLY POSSESSES OR, DISPLAYS, OR SUBMITS TO
THE DEPARTMENT OR ANY OTHER PERSON ANY FALSIFIED OR ALTERED PERMIT,
LICENSE, OR CERTIFICATE ISSUED OR REQUIRED PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE TO
DEMONSTRATE COMPLIANCE WITH ANY ENVIRONMENTAL REGULATION, PERMIT
CONDITION, OR OTHER REGULATORY REQUIREMENT UNDER THIS ARTICLE IS
GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO:

(1) FOR A FIRST OFFENSE, A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$10,000 OR
 IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 6 MONTHS OR BOTH; OR

(2) IF THE CONVICTION IS FOR A VIOLATION COMMITTED SUBSEQUENT
 TO A CONVICTION OF THE PERSON UNDER ANY SECTION OF THIS ARTICLE, A FINE
 NOT EXCEEDING \$50,000 FOR EACH VIOLATION OR IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 2
 YEARS OR BOTH.

27 (C) ANY FINE IMPOSED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SECTION SHALL BE
28 ORDERED PAID INTO ANY APPLICABLE SPECIAL FUND AUTHORIZED TO RECEIVE
29 FINES FOR VIOLATIONS OF ANY SECTION OF THIS ARTICLE THAT REQUIRES OR
30 AUTHORIZES THE DOCUMENT THAT IS THE SUBJECT OF THIS VIOLATION.

31 (D) (1) THE ATTORNEY GENERAL SHALL TAKE CHARGE OF, INVESTIGATE,
32 PROSECUTE, AND DEFEND ON BEHALF OF THE STATE EVERY CASE ARISING UNDER
33 THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION, INCLUDING THE RECOVERY OF ANY FINES.

34 (2) THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION MAY NOT LIMIT OR AFFECT THE
35 POWER OR AUTHORITY OF THE STATE'S ATTORNEY FOR EACH COUNTY AND THE CITY
36 OF BALTIMORE UNDER ARTICLE 10, § 34 OF THE CODE.

37 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 38 effect October 1, 2006.
