	(i) On or before July 1, 2001, develop and implement a system to comparatively evaluate the quality of care outcomes and performance measurements of hospitals and ambulatory surgical facilities on an objective basis; and
24	(ii) Annually publish the summary findings of the evaluation.
	(2) (i) The purpose of a comparable performance measurement system established under this subsection is to improve the quality of care provided by hospitals and ambulatory surgical facilities by establishing a common set of

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1 performance measurements and disseminating the findings of the performance 2 measurements to hospitals, ambulatory surgical facilities, consumers, and interested 3 parties. 4 In developing the performance measurement system, the (ii) 5 Commission shall consider the geographic location, urban or rural orientation, and 6 teaching or nonteaching status of the hospital and the ambulatory surgical facilities, and the health status of the population served. 8 The system, where appropriate, shall solicit performance information (3) 9 from consumers. 10 (i) The Commission may adopt regulations to establish the system 11 of evaluation provided under this subsection. 12 (ii) Before adopting regulations to implement an evaluation system 13 under this subsection, the Commission shall: 14 1.
