

- 13 (d) The Commission may use, for the maintenance and administration of the
- 14 building, any funds that the General Assembly or the Mayor and City Council of
- 15 Baltimore appropriate for those purposes.
- 16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 17 October June 1, 2006.
