(A) AN EMPLOYEE OF THE CITY OF FROSTBURG SHALL RECEIVE ONE-HALF
OF THE SERVICE CREDIT FOR ELIGIBILITY SERVICE AND CREDITABLE SERVICE
BEFORE THE EFFECTIVE DATE IN THE AMOUNT OF THE EMPLOYEES' CREDIT, AS
CERTIFIED BY THE CITY OF FROSTBURG AS OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE.

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(B) IF AN EMPLOYEE OR FORMER EMPLOYEE OF THE CITY OF FROSTBURG
 BECOMES A MEMBER OF THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM AT ANY TIME AFTER
 THE EFFECTIVE DATE, THE EMPLOYEE MAY NOT RECEIVE SERVICE CREDIT FOR
 EMPLOYMENT WITH THE CITY OF FROSTBURG BEFORE THE EFFECTIVE DATE.
