12 (i) who was employed by the Department of Natural Resources on 13 July 1, 1990 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 2002;

14 (ii) who was employed by the Field Enforcement Division on June 15 30, 1995 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 2002;

16(iii)who was employed by the Maryland Transportation Authority17on June 30, 1997 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 2002;

18 (iv) who was employed by the Baltimore City Sheriff's Department
19 on June 30, 1997 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 2002;

20 (v) who was employed by the University of Maryland Police Force 21 on June 30, 1999 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 2002;

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1 who was employed by the Department of General Services, (xi) 2 Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, Motor Vehicle Administration, and 3 Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation Police Force on June 30, 2000 and 4 who elects membership on or before December 31, 2002; 5 who was employed by the Military Department as a firefighter (xii) 6 at Martin State Airport on June 30, 2001, and who elects membership on or before 7 December 31, 2002: 8 (xiii) who was employed on June 30, 2002, by the Division of 9 Rehabilitation Services in the Department of Education as a police officer certified in 10 accordance with the Maryland Police and Correctional Training Commissions, and 11 who elects membership on or before December 31, 2002; 12 (xiv) who was employed on June 30, 2004, by the Salisbury Fire 13 Department as a firefighter or paramedic and who elects membership on or before 14 December 31, 2004, if eligible under Title 31, Subtitle 2A of this article; [or] 15 who was employed on June 30, 2005, by the Department of (xv)16 State Police as an aviator operating an aircraft for the State Emergency Medical 17 System, and who elects membership on or before December 31, 2005; OR 18 WHO WAS EMPLOYED ON JUNE 30, 2006, BY THE HARFORD (XVI) 19 COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE AS A DEPUTY SHERIFF, AND WHO ELECTS MEMBERSHIP 20 ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 2006. 21 (2)To elect to be a member of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension 22 System, an individual shall file a written application with the State Retirement 23 Agency. 24 (3)If an individual does not elect membership during the applicable 25 period specified under paragraph (1) of this subsection, the individual may not 26 become a member of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System. 27 31-2A-01. 28 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated. 29 "Effective date" means the date that an eligible governmental unit (b) 30 commenced or commences participation in the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension 31 System. 32 "Eligible governmental unit" means a governmental unit that is eligible to (c) 33 participate in the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System under § 31-2A-02 of 34 this subtitle. 35 (d) (1)"Firefighter" means: 36 (i) a paid firefighter, as determined by the eligible governmental

(ii) (e) "Law enforcement officer" means an individual WHO: 6 7 IS certified by the Maryland Police Training Commission as a law (1)8 enforcement officer; OR IS A DEPUTY SHERIFF EMPLOYED BY THE HARFORD COUNTY 9 (2)10 SHERIFF'S OFFICE AS A DETENTION CENTER OFFICER. 11 (f) (1)"Local pension system" means a retirement or pension system of an 12 eligible governmental unit.
