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OF AN EXPIRATION DATE COINCIDING WITH THE OFFENDER'S 20TH BIRTHDAY, SHALL EXPIRE 60 DAYS AFTER THE LICENSEE'S 21ST BIRTHDAY.

3 [(3)] (4) A license is renewable on the presentation of an application, the 4 payment of the renewal fee required by § 16-111.1 of this subtitle, and satisfactory 5 completion of the examination required or authorized by subsection (h) of this section:

6 (i) Within 6 months before its expiration; or

7 (ii) When a driver qualifies for a corrected license issued under § 8 16-114.1(c) of this subtitle.

9 [(4)] (5) (I) Except as provided in subsection (e) of this section, the

10 Administration may not renew an individual's license for more than one consecutive

11 term without requiring the individual to appear in person at an office of the

12 Administration.

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(II) THE ADMINISTRATION MAY NOT RENEW THE LICENSE OF AN
INDIVIDUAL WHO IS A CHILD SEXUAL OFFENDER, AS DEFINED IN § 11-701 OF THE
CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ARTICLE, REQUIRED TO REGISTER UNDER TITLE 11,
SUBTITLE 7 OF THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ARTICLE WITHOUT REQUIRING THE
