

- 9 (j) The Task Force shall submit an interim report to the Governor and the
- 10 General Assembly, on or before December 1, 2006, and report its final findings and
- 11 recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State
- 12 Government Article, the General Assembly, on or before December 1, 2007.
- SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall
- 14 be construed to apply retroactively and shall be applied to a Maryland resident who
- 15 was a member of the uniform services of the United States serving in the Afghanistan
- 16 conflict on or after October 24, 2001, or the Iraq conflict on or after March 19, 2003.
- 17 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 18 June 1, 2006. Section 3 of this Act shall remain effective for a period of 1 year, 6
- 19 months and 1 day and, at the end of December 1, 2007, with no further action
- 20 required by the General Assembly, Section 3 of this Act shall be abrogated and of no
- 21 further force and effect.
