3 FOR the purpose of ~~expanding~~ clarifying the category of persons considered to be
4 public employees for purposes of certain prohibitions against bribery; defining a
5 certain term; altering a certain definition; and generally relating to bribery of a
6 public official.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article - Criminal Law**

15 9-201.

16 (a) (1) In this section[,] THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
17 INDICATED.

18 (2) "POLITICAL SUBDIVISION" INCLUDES A:

19 (I) COUNTY;

- 1 (II) MUNICIPAL CORPORATION;
- 2 (III) BI-COUNTY OR MULTICOUNTY AGENCY;
- 3 (IV) COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION;
- 4 (V) PUBLIC AUTHORITY; OR
- 5 (VI) SPECIAL TAXING DISTRICT.

6 (3) (I) ["public] "PUBLIC employee":

7 (1)] means an officer or employee of:

8 [(i)] 1. the State; or

9 [(ii)] 2. a [county, municipal corporation, bicounty or multicounty
10 agency, or other] political subdivision of the State; and].

11 [(2)] (II) "PUBLIC EMPLOYEE" includes:

12 [(i)] 1. an executive officer of the State;

13 [(ii)] 2. a judge of the State;

14 [(iii)] 3. a judicial officer of the State;

15 [(iv)] 4. a member or officer of the General Assembly;

16 [(v)] 5. a member of the police force of Baltimore City or the
17 Department of State Police; and

18 [(vi)] 6. a member, officer, or executive officer of a [municipal
19 corporation] POLITICAL SUBDIVISION.

20 (b) A person may not bribe or attempt to bribe a public employee to influence
21 the public employee in the performance of an official duty of the public employee.

22 (c) A public employee may not demand or receive a bribe, fee, reward, or
23 testimonial to:

24 (1) influence the performance of the official duties of the public
25 employee; or

26 (2) neglect or fail to perform the official duties of the public employee.

27 (d) A person who violates this section is guilty of the misdemeanor of bribery
28 and on conviction:

29 (1) is subject to imprisonment for not less than 2 years and not exceeding
30 12 years or a fine not less than \$100 and not exceeding \$5,000 or both;

1 (2) may not vote; and

2 (3) may not hold an office of trust or profit in the State.

3 (e) A person who violates this section is subject to § 5-106(b) of the Courts
4 Article.

5 (f) (1) A person who violates this section:

6 (i) is a competent witness; and

7 (ii) subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, may be compelled to
8 testify against any person who may have violated this section.

9 (2) A person compelled to testify for the State under paragraph (1) of this
10 subsection is immune from prosecution for a crime about which the person was
11 compelled to testify.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
13 October 1, 2006.
