1 AN ACT concerning

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Community Colleges - Baltimore City Community College - Governance

3 FOR the purpose of clarifying the role of the Board of Trustees of Baltimore City

- 4 Community College; prohibiting the Board of Trustees from participating in
- 5 certain operations of the College; requiring the Board of Trustees to appoint a
- 6 certain interim president under certain circumstances; providing that the
- 7 interim president may not be a member of the Board of Trustees; authorizing
- 8 the Board of Trustees, in consultation with the Faculty Senate Executive
- 9 Committee, to establish, modify, or amend certain policies and procedures of a
- 10 certain faculty contract; clarifying that the President is a certain liaison;
- 11 altering certain responsibilities of the President; requiring the formation of a
- 12 certain faculty search committee to fill certain faculty vacancies; providing for
- 13 the composition of the faculty search committee prohibiting more than a certain
- 14 <u>number of members of the Board of Trustees from being included on certain</u>
- 15 <u>search committees</u>; altering the amount of money provided by Baltimore City to
- 16 the College; requiring certain reports; requiring the Board of Trustees and the
- 17 President to develop and implement an independent system for hearing faculty
- 18 grievances; requiring a certain system to include the use of a certain
- 19 independent body that is not affiliated with certain entities to hear certain
- 20 grievances and make recommendations to the Board of Trustees; requiring the
- 21 Board of Trustees to adopt certain regulations; making certain technical
- 22 corrections; and generally relating to the governance of Baltimore City

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 (b) "Board of Trustees" means the Board of Trustees of Baltimore City17 Community College.

18 (c) "College" means Baltimore City Community College, formerly known as19 the New Community College of Baltimore.

20 16-505.

(b) (1) The Board of Trustees shall exercise general control [and
management of] OVER the College and establish [policies] BROAD POLICY AND
LONG-RANGE PLANNING to effect the efficient operation of the College.

24 (2) THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES MAY NOT PARTICIPATE IN THE 25 DAY-TO-DAY OPERATIONS OF THE COLLEGE.

26 (h) (1) The Board of Trustees shall appoint a President of the College who27 shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the College and the Chief of Staff for the Board28 of Trustees.

29 (2) The Board of Trustees may create other offices in the College and30 provide for the appointment of qualified persons to those offices.

31 (3) (I) THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES SHALL APPOINT AN INTERIM
32 PRESIDENT TO CARRY OUT THE DUTIES OF THE PRESIDENT WITHIN 60 90 DAYS
33 AFTER THE OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT BECOMES VACANT.

(II)THE INTERIM PRESIDENT MAY NOT BE A MEMBER OF THE 1 2 BOARD OF TRUSTEES. 3 [(3)] (4)(i) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Board of 4 Trustees may create any position to the extent that the cost of the position, including 5 any fringe benefit costs, is funded from grant or special project funds. 6 (ii) The Board of Trustees shall abolish a position created under 7 this paragraph when the grant or special project funds are insufficient to fund the 8 cost of the position, including any fringe benefit costs. 9 This paragraph may not be construed to require any additional (iii) 10 State General Fund support. 11 (iv) By September 1 of each year, the Board OF TRUSTEES shall 12 submit an annual position accountability report to the Department of Budget and Management, the Department of Legislative Services, and the [Maryland Higher 13 14 Education] Commission reporting the total positions created and the cost and the 15 funding source for any positions created by [Baltimore City Community] THE College 16 in the previous fiscal year. The total number of positions authorized under this paragraph 17 (v) 18 shall be limited as specified annually in the State budget bill. 19 (i)(1)The Board of Trustees may fix the salaries and terms of employment 20 of the President, faculty, and officers of the College. THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE FACULTY 21 (2)22 SENATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE, MAY ESTABLISH, MODIFY, OR AMEND THE 23 POLICIES AND PROCEDURES IN THE FACULTY CONTRACT THAT GOVERN THE 24 EMPLOYMENT RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE FACULTY AND THE COLLEGE. 25 16-506. The President of the College shall: 26 (a) 27 Report directly to the Board of Trustees AND BE THE SOLE LIAISON (1)28 BETWEEN THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES AND THE COLLEGE'S FACULTY, ADMINISTRATORS, AND STAFF; 29 30 Be responsible and accountable to the Board of Trustees for the (2)31 discipline and successful conduct of the College and supervision of each of its 32 departments; 33 (3)Take every initiative in: 34 (i) Implementing the policies of the Board of Trustees and the 35 College; and 36 (ii) Promoting the development and efficiency of the College;

1 [(4) Hire and discharge faculty and employees as authorized by the Board 2 of Trustees;]

3 (4) (I) BE DIRECTLY RESPONSIBLE FOR HIRING, PROMOTING, AND
4 DISCHARGING ALL FACULTY AND EMPLOYEES WHO REPORT TO VICE PRESIDENTS,
5 EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS, DIRECTORS, DEANS, OR DEPARTMENT CHAIRS AND
6 EQUIVALENT POSITIONS THAT DO NOT REPORT DIRECTLY TO THE PRESIDENT; AND

(II) MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES, FOR
THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES' APPROVAL, RELATING TO THE HIRING, PROMOTING, AND
DISCHARGING OF ALL FACULTY AND EMPLOYEES WHO ARE VICE PRESIDENTS,
EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS, DEANS, OR DEPARTMENT CHAIRS AND EQUIVALENT
POSITIONS REPORTING DIRECTLY TO THE PRESIDENT;

12 (5) Attend all meetings of the Board of Trustees, except that the 13 President may be excused by the Board of Trustees from discussions concerning the

14 President or the position of President; and

15 (6) Carry out other duties as authorized by the Board of Trustees.

17 (A) A FACULTY SEARCH COMMITTEE SHALL BE FORMED TO FILL ANY 18 VACANCY ON THE FACULTY OF A DEPARTMENT IN THE COLLEGE.

- 19 (B) THE FACULTY SEARCH COMMITTEE SHALL CONSIST OF:
- 20 (1) THE CHAIR OF THE DEPARTMENT WITH THE FACULTY VACANCY;
- 21 (2) THE DEAN OF THE COLLEGE;

22 (3) THE HUMAN RESOURCES DIRECTOR OF THE COLLEGE;

23 (4) A MEMBER OF THE FACULTY SENATE; AND

24 (5) A PROFESSIONAL INDIVIDUAL WITH EXPERTISE IN THE FIELD OF 25 THE DEPARTMENT.

26 (C) A FACULTY SEARCH COMMITTEE MAY INCLUDE UP TO TWO ADDITIONAL
 27 MEMBERS AT THE DISCRETION OF THE CHAIR OF THE DEPARTMENT WITH THE

28 FACULTY VACANCY.

29 (A) THE PRESIDENT OF THE COLLEGE SHALL FORM A SEARCH COMMITTEE TO
 30 FILL VACANCIES IN FACULTY OR OTHER STAFF POSITIONS.

31(B)A SEARCH COMMITTEE FORMED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION32MAY NOT INCLUDE MORE THAN TWO MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES.

1 16-512. 2 (d) (1)Through June 30, 1999, the City of Baltimore shall be (i) 3 responsible for providing at least \$600,000 in each fiscal year to support education at 4 the [Baltimore City Community] College. 5 Of this amount, in each fiscal year, at least \$300,000 shall be (ii) 6 expended and administered by the College for tuition reimbursement or scholarships 7 to attend classes at the [Baltimore City Community] College, and the remaining 8 balance shall be expended in a manner consistent with the educational mission of the 9 [Baltimore City Community] College. The source of the \$600,000 is not limited to tax or fee revenues 10 (iii) 11 generated by the City of Baltimore. 12 (2)(i) Beginning on July 1, 1999, the City of Baltimore shall be 13 responsible for providing at least \$800,000 in each fiscal year to support education at 14 the [Baltimore City Community] College. 15 Of this amount, in each fiscal year, at least \$500,000 shall be (ii) 16 expended and administered by the College for tuition reimbursement or scholarships 17 to attend classes at the [Baltimore City Community] College, and the remaining 18 balance shall be expended in a manner consistent with the educational mission of the [Baltimore City Community] College. 19 20 (iii) The source of the \$800,000 is not limited to tax or fee revenues 21 generated by the City of Baltimore. 22 BEGINNING ON JULY 1, 2006, THE CITY OF BALTIMORE SHALL (3)(I) 23 BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PROVIDING AT LEAST \$1,000,000 IN EACH FISCAL YEAR TO 24 SUPPORT EDUCATION AT THE COLLEGE. 25 OF THIS AMOUNT, IN EACH FISCAL YEAR, AT LEAST \$400,000 (II)26 SHALL BE EXPENDED AND ADMINISTERED BY THE COLLEGE FOR TUITION 27 REIMBURSEMENT OR SCHOLARSHIPS TO ATTEND CLASSES AT THE COLLEGE, AND 28 THE REMAINING BALANCE SHALL BE GIVEN TO THE CLARENCE BLOUNT CHILD 29 DEVELOPMENT CENTER EXPENDED IN A MANNER CONSISTENT WITH THE

30 EDUCATIONAL MISSION OF THE COLLEGE.

31 (III) THE SOURCE OF THE \$1,000,000 IS NOT LIMITED TO TAX OR FEE
 32 REVENUES GENERATED BY THE CITY OF BALTIMORE.

(IV) THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES SHALL SUBMIT AN ANNUAL REPORT
ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31 TO THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE FOR THE CITY OF
BALTIMORE REGARDING THE EXPENDITURES MADE UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH.

36 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

1 (a) The Board of Trustees of Baltimore City Community College (College) and 2 the President of the College shall develop and implement an independent system for 3 hearing faculty grievances.

4 (b) The system required under subsection (a) of this section shall include the 5 use of an independent body, unaffiliated with the Board of Trustees, the President of 6 the College, the Faculty Senate, or the Office of Human Resources in the College, to 7 hear grievances and make recommendations to the Board of Trustees.

8 (c) The Board of Trustees shall adopt regulations to carry out the provisions of 9 this section.

10 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 11 June 1, 2006.
