2 Creation of a State Debt - Prince George's County - George Washington House

- 4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of
- \$100,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Directors of the
- 6 Anacostia Watershed Society, Inc. for certain development or improvement
- 7 purposes; providing for disbursement of the loan proceeds, subject to a
- 8 requirement that the grantee provide and expend a matching fund; requiring
- 9 the grantee to grant and convey a certain easement to the Maryland Historical
- Trust; establishing a deadline for the encumbrance or expenditure of the loan
- proceeds; and providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing
- the loan.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

14 MARYLAND, That:

- 15 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on
- 16 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Prince
- 17 George's County George Washington House Loan of 2006 in the total principal
- 18 amount of \$100,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of
- 19 State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public
- 20 Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8-117 through 8-124 of
- 21 the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, § 22 of the Code.
- 22 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as
- 23 a single issue or may be consolidated and sold as part of a single issue of bonds under
- 24 § 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.
- 25 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer
- 26 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and
- 27 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then
- 28 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the
- 29 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable
- 30 architects' and engineers' fees: as a grant to the Board of Directors of the Anacostia
- 31 Watershed Society, Inc. (referred to hereafter in this Act as "the grantee") for the

- 1 planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, and capital 2 equipping of the George Washington House, located in Bladensburg.
- 3 An annual State tax is imposed on all assessable property in the State in 4 rate and amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds as and
- 5 when due and until paid in full. The principal shall be discharged within 15 years
- 6 after the date of issuance of the bonds.
- 7 Prior to the payment of any funds under the provisions of this Act for the (5)
- 8 purposes set forth in Section 1(3) above, the grantee shall provide and expend a
- 9 matching fund of \$50,000. No part of the grantee's matching fund may be provided,
- 10 either directly or indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated or
- 11 unappropriated. No part of the fund may consist of real property. The fund may
- 12 consist of in kind contributions or funds expended prior to the effective date of this
- 13 Act. In case of any dispute as to the amount of the matching fund or what money or
- 14 assets may qualify as matching funds, the Board of Public Works shall determine the
- 15 matter and the Board's decision is final. The grantee has until June 1, 2008, to
- 16 present evidence satisfactory to the Board of Public Works that a matching fund will
- 17 be provided. If satisfactory evidence is presented, the Board shall certify this fact to
- 18 the State Treasurer, and the proceeds of the loan shall be expended for the purposes
- 19 provided in this Act.
- 20 Prior to the issuance of the bonds, the grantee shall grant and convey (6) (a)
- 21 to the Maryland Historical Trust a perpetual preservation easement to the extent of
- 22 its interest:
- 23 (i) On the land or such portion of the land acceptable to the Trust;
- 24 and
- 25 (ii) On the exterior and interior, where appropriate, of the historic
- 26 structures.
- 27 If the grantee or beneficiary of the grant holds a lease on the land
- 28 and structures, the Trust may accept an easement on the leasehold interest.
- 29 The easement must be in form and substance acceptable to the Trust (c)
- 30 and any liens or encumbrances against the land or the structures must be acceptable
- 31 to the Trust.
- 32 (7) The proceeds of the loan must be expended or encumbered by the Board of
- 33 Public Works for the purposes provided in this Act no later than June 1, 2013. If any
- 34 funds authorized by this Act remain unexpended or unencumbered after June 1,
- 35 2013, the amount of the unencumbered or unexpended authorization shall be
- 36 canceled and be of no further effect. If bonds have been issued for the loan, the
- 37 amount of unexpended or unencumbered bond proceeds shall be disposed of as
- 38 provided in § 8-129 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.
- 39 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 40 June 1, 2006.
