1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Community Colleges - State Funding - Size Factor Component**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the Senator John A. Cade Funding Formula for
4 community colleges to allow certain colleges that are no longer eligible for
5 funding under the size factor component to receive a certain amount of funding
6 for a certain period; providing for the distribution of certain size factor
7 component grants; making stylistic changes; and generally relating to the
8 Senator John A. Cade Funding Formula for community colleges.

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 **Article - Education**

4 16-305.

5 (a) The formula used for the distribution of funds to the community colleges in
6 the State shall be known as the Senator John A. Cade Funding Formula.

7 (b) (13) "Total State operating fund" means the sum of community college
8 State appropriations for direct grants.

9 (c) (6) (i) The size factor component shall be [a set percentage] 2% of the
10 year's total State operating fund [as follows:

- 11 1. For fiscal year 1998, 4% of total funding;
12 2. For fiscal year 1999, 3% of total funding; and
13 3. For fiscal year 2000 and each fiscal year thereafter, 2% of
14 total funding].

15 (ii) [The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (III) OF THIS
16 PARAGRAPH, THE funds available for the size factor component shall be divided and
17 distributed equally to each board that operates a community college or colleges at
18 which the total number of full-time equivalent students is less than or equal to 80%
19 of the statewide median.

20 (III) 1. BEGINNING WITH THE FIRST FISCAL YEAR THAT A BOARD
21 NO LONGER MEETS THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF
22 THIS PARAGRAPH, THE BOARD SHALL CONTINUE TO RECEIVE A PERCENTAGE OF THE
23 SIZE FACTOR COMPONENT ~~IF THAT THE BOARD~~ RECEIVED IN THE LAST FISCAL YEAR
24 FOR WHICH THE BOARD WAS ELIGIBLE, AS FOLLOWS:

- 25 ~~1.~~ A. 80% FOR THE FIRST FISCAL YEAR;
26 ~~2.~~ B. 60% FOR THE SECOND FISCAL YEAR;
27 ~~3.~~ C. 40% FOR THE THIRD FISCAL YEAR;
28 ~~4.~~ D. 20% FOR THE FOURTH FISCAL YEAR; AND
29 ~~5.~~ E. 0% FOR THE FIFTH AND EACH SUBSEQUENT FISCAL
30 YEAR.

31 2. THE DISTRIBUTIONS REQUIRED UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH
32 (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH SHALL BE MADE FROM THE REMAINING FUNDS AVAILABLE
33 FOR THE SIZE FACTOR COMPONENT AFTER ANY DISTRIBUTIONS REQUIRED UNDER
34 THIS SUBPARAGRAPH.

1 [(iii)] (IV) In determining the eligibility of a board for a size factor
2 component, the number of full-time equivalent students at all campuses and colleges
3 operated by the board shall be added together.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
5 July 1, 2006.
