1 AN ACT concerning

2 Public Health - Mercury-Free Vaccines - Requirements

- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting certain individuals from being vaccinated with
- 4 certain vaccines containing certain amounts of mercury on or after a certain
- 5 date; prohibiting certain individuals from being vaccinated or injected with
- 6 certain vaccines or other products containing any amount of mercury on or after

- 10 certain public health emergencies; prohibiting the authorization of the use of
- certain vaccines for longer than a certain amount of time except under certain

- 21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 23 Article Health General
- 24 18-110.
- 25 (A) (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, ON OR
- 26 AFTER JANUARY 1, 2007, AN INDIVIDUAL MAY NOT BE VACCINATED WITH A VACCINE
- 27 THAT CONTAINS MORE THAN 1.25 MICROGRAMS OF MERCURY PER 0.5 MILLILITER
- 28 DOSE.

- ON OR AFTER JUNE 1, 2009, AN INDIVIDUAL MAY NOT BE
- 2 VACCINATED OR INJECTED WITH A VACCINE OR OTHER PRODUCT THAT CONTAINS
- 3 MERCURY IN ANY AMOUNT INCLUDING PRESERVATIVE LEVEL AMOUNTS OR TRACE
- 4 AMOUNTS.
- IN THE EVENT OF THE THREAT OR OCCURRENCE OF A CHEMICAL OR 5 (B) (1)
- 6 BIOLOGICAL TERRORIST INCIDENT OR OTHER PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY,
- 7 INCLUDING A PUBLIC HEALTH EPIDEMIC OR SHORTAGE OF A NECESSARY VACCINE
- 8 AVAILABLE AT A REASONABLE COST, THE SECRETARY MAY AUTHORIZE THE USE OF
- 9 A VACCINE THAT DOES NOT MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS

- (2) THE AUTHORIZATION OF THE USE OF A VACCINE UNDER
- 12 PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION MAY NOT CONTINUE FOR LONGER THAN 1 YEAR

- RENEWS THE AUTHORIZATION FOR THE USE OF THE VACCINE 14 (I)

- DETERMINES THAT A RENEWAL OF AUTHORIZATION IS 17 (II)

- 20 HOURS OF AUTHORIZING THE RENEWAL INCLUDING THE REASONS FOR THE

- 22 A PERSON MAY PETITION THE SECRETARY, IN WRITING, TO REQUEST (C)
- 23 THAT THE SECRETARY AUTHORIZE THE USE OF A VACCINE IN ACCORDANCE WITH
- 24 THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION.
- A PERSON MAY REQUEST, IN WRITING, THAT THE SECRETARY SEND 25
- 26 THE REQUESTING PERSON NOTICE OF:
- 27 ANY REQUEST BY A PERSON THAT THE SECRETARY AUTHORIZE (I)
- 28 THE USE OF A VACCINE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (B)
- 29 OF THIS SECTION; AND
- THE DECISION OF THE SECRETARY TO USE A VACCINE IN 30 (II)
- 31 ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION
- 32 INCLUDING THE REASONS FOR AUTHORIZATION.
- 33 THE SECRETARY SHALL NOTIFY A PERSON REQUESTING NOTICE
- 34 UNDER PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION OF THE APPROPRIATE INFORMATION
- 35 WITHIN 7 DAYS OF THE DAY THAT THE SECRETARY:
- RECEIVES A WRITTEN REQUEST UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF (I)
- 37 THIS SUBSECTION; OR

- 1 (II) AUTHORIZED THE USE OF A VACCINE IN ACCORDANCE WITH
- 2 THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION.
- 3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 4 October 1, 2006.
