2 **Creation of a State Debt - Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of**  
3 **2006; and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 1997, 1998, 1999,**  
4 **2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, and 2005, and the Southern Maryland Regional**  
5 **Strategy-Action Plan for Agriculture Loans of 2006, 2007, 2008, and 2009**

6 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of ~~Six~~  
7 ~~Hundred Sixty Nine Million, Three Hundred Fifty Eight Thousand Dollars~~  
8 ~~(\$669,358,000), Seven Hundred Eight Million, Eight Hundred Eighty Four~~  
9 ~~Thousand, Four Dollars (\$708,884,004), Seven Hundred Eleven Million, One~~  
10 ~~Hundred Fifty-Seven, Eight Hundred Thirty-Three Dollars (\$711,157,833),~~ the  
11 proceeds to be used, subject to certain restrictions, for certain necessary building,  
12 construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and  
13 capital equipment purchases of this State, for acquiring certain real estate in  
14 connection therewith, and for grants to certain subdivisions and other  
15 organizations for certain development and improvement purposes, subject to the

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That:

(1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2006 in the total principal amount of \$669,358,000 \$708,884,004 \$711,157,833. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with Sections 8-117 through 8-124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, Section 22 of the Code.

(2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as a single issue of bonds under Section 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

(3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable architects' and engineers' fees:

(e) (1) On or before December 31 of each year, the Interagency Committee shall provide recommendations to the Board of Public Works for public school construction projects that comprise [at least] 75% of the [anticipated] PRELIMINARY school construction allocation, DETERMINED UNDER § 8-113 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE, for the following fiscal year.

(2) The remaining public school construction allocation for the following fiscal year may be allocated by the Board of Public Works as provided in regulation.

SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding § 5-302(e) of the Education Article or any other provision of law, for fiscal year 2008, the Board of Public Works may not, before May 1, 2007, approve public school construction projects that comprise more than 75% of the preliminary school construction allocation recommended by the Governor as required in § 8-113 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

*SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, if a capital project is funded using any State funds and a sign is posted before, during, or after construction that indicates that the State of Maryland is participating in the project, the sign shall reference the participation of the Maryland General Assembly in the same manner, format, and size as the participation of any State official or unit of government is referenced.*

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly declares that it is the public policy of this State to manage State general obligation bond debt in a manner that will maintain Maryland's AAA bond rating. The General Assembly further declares that legislative oversight, control, and review of all forms of State obligations are essential to maintenance of the State's existing bond rating and protection of the fiscal integrity of the State.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, before work may commence pursuant to any supplement to any appropriation contained in this Act, satisfactory evidence must be given to the Board of Public Works that the project can be completed with the aggregate of the funds in this Act and previously appropriated for the stated purpose.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, with the approval of the Department of Budget and Management, any appropriation for construction provided in this Act may be used to purchase capital equipment if the amount of the appropriation exceeds the amount required for construction expenses, including allowances for contingencies.

SECTION ~~6.~~ ~~11.~~ 12. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as otherwise provided in this Act, before a State agency or institution named in this Act as responsible for an individual item may begin work with funds appropriated by this



1 Act, the agency or institution shall provide satisfactory evidence to the Board of  
2 Public Works that the work described in the individual item can be completed with  
3 the funds specified for that item.
