A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Creation of a State Debt - Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2006**
3 **and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000,**
4 **2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, and 2005**

5 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of Six
6 Hundred Sixty-Nine Million, Three Hundred Fifty-Eight Thousand Dollars
7 (\$669,358,000), the proceeds to be used for certain necessary building,
8 construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and
9 capital equipment purchases of this State, for acquiring certain real estate in
10 connection therewith, and for grants to certain subdivisions and other
11 organizations for certain development and improvement purposes, subject to the
12 requirement that certain grantees provide and expend certain matching funds
13 by certain dates; providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds
14 evidencing the loan; authorizing certain unexpended appropriations in certain
15 prior capital budgets and bond loans to be expended for other public projects;
16 altering certain requirements for certain programs in certain prior capital
17 budgets and bond loans; providing that the authorizations of State Debt in
18 certain prior capital budgets and bond loans be reduced by certain amounts;
19 providing for certain additional information to be detailed about each project in
20 the capital program; repealing a requirement for a certain appropriation; and
21 generally relating to the financing of certain capital projects.

4 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
5 MARYLAND, That:

6 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur
7 indebtedness on behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as
8 the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2006 in the total principal amount
9 of \$669,358,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of
10 State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public
11 Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with Sections 8-117 through
12 8-124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, Section 22 of the
13 Code.

14 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be
15 sold as a single issue of bonds under Section 8-122 of the State Finance and
16 Procurement Article.

17 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the
18 Treasurer and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling,
19 and delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and
20 then shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by
21 the Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable

9 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly
10 declares that it is the public policy of this State to manage State general obligation
11 bond debt in a manner that will maintain Maryland’s AAA bond rating. The General
