2 **Creation of a State Debt - Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of**
3 **2006; and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 1997, 1998, 1999,**
4 **2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, and 2005, and the Southern Maryland Regional**
5 **Strategy-Action Plan for Agriculture Loans of 2006, 2007, 2008, and 2009**

6 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of ~~Six~~
7 ~~Hundred Sixty Nine Million, Three Hundred Fifty Eight Thousand Dollars~~
8 ~~(\$669,358,000), Seven Hundred Eight Million, Eight Hundred Eighty-Four~~
9 ~~Thousand, Four Dollars (\$708,884,004),~~ the proceeds to be used for certain
10 necessary building, construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion,
11 replacement, and capital equipment purchases of this State, for acquiring
12 certain real estate in connection therewith, and for grants to certain
13 subdivisions and other organizations for certain development and improvement
14 purposes, subject to the requirement that certain grantees provide and expend
15 certain matching funds by certain dates; stating the intent of the General
16 Assembly that funds be provided for a certain project in a fiscal year; requiring
17 the Interagency Committee on School Construction to allocate certain funds
18 available for public school construction projects in a certain manner and to
19 include certain funds in certain allocations; providing that certain allocations
20 made by the Interagency Committee are not subject to approval by the Board of
21 Public Works; requiring that certain amounts approved for public school
22 construction projects be allocated to certain counties; requiring that certain
23 additional funds be provided to certain counties to be expended for certain
24 public school construction projects subject to a certain priority; providing that
25 certain school construction funds may be applied to certain other projects or
26 reverted to a certain fund under certain circumstances; authorizing the
27 Interagency Committee to allocate certain additional funds in a certain manner
28 after certain notice to the presiding officers of the General Assembly; providing

1 generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan; altering certain
2 amounts of State Debt authorized to be created under the Southern Maryland
3 Regional Strategy-Action Plan for Agriculture Loans of 2006, 2007, and 2008;
4 authorizing the creation of a State Debt in a certain year, the proceeds to be
5 used as a grant to the Tri-County Council for Southern Maryland to assist in
6 the implementation of a certain plan; providing generally for the issuance and
7 sale of bonds evidencing certain loans; authorizing certain unexpended
8 appropriations in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans to be expended
9 for other public projects; altering certain requirements for certain programs in
10 certain prior capital budgets and bond loans; providing that the authorizations
11 of State Debt in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans be reduced by
12 certain amounts; authorizing premiums from the sale of State bonds in certain
13 fiscal years to remain in or be transferred to a certain fund and to be used for
14 certain capital projects under certain circumstances; requiring the Comptroller
15 to make certain transfers, adjustments, and reconciliations; requiring that
16 certain funds authorized for certain projects be expended before certain other
17 State funds; providing that if the rates of State tax on assessable property
18 certified by the Board of Public Works for a certain fiscal year are not less than
19 the rates levied for a certain fiscal year, a certain amount of certain general
20 obligation bonds shall be in certain series, denominations, and maturities as to
21 require the full repayment of principal and interest on the bonds by a certain
22 date; repealing certain authority for the Governor to alter certain

24 advisable; repealing a provision of law that provides that a certain allocation of

- 30 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
31 MARYLAND, That:
- 32 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur
33 indebtedness on behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as
34 the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2006 in the total principal amount
35 of ~~\$669,358,000~~ \$708,884,004. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and
36 delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of
37 Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with Sections 8-117

1 through 8-124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, Section
2 22 of the Code.

3 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be
4 sold as a single issue of bonds under Section 8-122 of the State Finance and
5 Procurement Article.

6 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the
7 Treasurer and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling,
8 and delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and
9 then shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by
10 the Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable
11 architects' and engineers' fees:

 17 projects for which the Interagency Committee on School Construction has allocated
 18 contingency funds.

19 (2) The Comptroller shall make any transfers or accounting adjustments
 20 and reconciliations necessary to implement the provisions of this Section.

21 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, if the rates of State tax
 22 on assessable property certified by the Board of Public Works for fiscal year 2007 are
 23 not less than the rates levied for fiscal year 2006, \$100,000,000 of any general
 24 obligation bonds issued before September 1, 2006 shall be in such series,
 25 denominations, and maturities as to require the full repayment of principal and
 26 interest on the bonds on or before June 30, 2007 with the intent that the resulting
 27 debt service savings shall be used to increase funding for public school construction in
 28 subsequent years.

29 SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland
 30 read as follows:

33 [(a)] On or before October 15 of each year, after considering the current
 34 estimate of the Committee, the Governor shall determine:

35 (1) the total authorizations of new State debt that the Governor

- 1 (i) general construction projects;
 2 (ii) school construction projects; and
 3 (iii) other special projects.

17 SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding §
 18 5-302(e) of the Education Article or any other provision of law, for fiscal year 2008,
 19 the Board of Public Works may not, before May 1, 2007, approve public school
 20 construction projects that comprise more than 75% of the preliminary school
 21 construction allocation recommended by the Governor as required in § 8-113 of the
 22 State Finance and Procurement Article.

23 SECTION 3- 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General
 24 Assembly declares that it is the public policy of this State to manage State general
 25 obligation bond debt in a manner that will maintain Maryland's AAA bond rating. The
 26 General Assembly further declares that legislative oversight, control, and review of
 27 all forms of State obligations are essential to maintenance of the State's existing bond
 28 rating and protection of the fiscal integrity of the State.

29 SECTION 4- 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, before work may
 30 commence pursuant to any supplement to any appropriation contained in this Act,
 31 satisfactory evidence must be given to the Board of Public Works that the project can
 32 be completed with the aggregate of the funds in this Act and previously appropriated
 33 for the stated purpose.

34 SECTION 5- 10. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, with the approval
 35 of the Department of Budget and Management, any appropriation for construction
 36 provided in this Act may be used to purchase capital equipment if the amount of the
 37 appropriation exceeds the amount required for construction expenses, including
 38 allowances for contingencies.

2 provided in this Act, before a State agency or institution named in this Act as
3 responsible for an individual item may begin work with funds appropriated by this
4 Act, the agency or institution shall provide satisfactory evidence to the Board of
5 Public Works that the work described in the individual item can be completed with
6 the funds specified for that item.

7 SECTION ~~7.~~ 12. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, with the approval
8 of the Department of Budget and Management, any appropriation under the
9 provisions of this Act that is in excess of the amount needed for a project may be
10 credited to the Construction Contingency Fund under Section 3-609 of the State
11 Finance and Procurement Article.

12 SECTION ~~8.~~ 13. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, if federal funds are
13 available to help accomplish any project identified in this Act, the State agency or
14 institution responsible for the project shall make efforts through proper
15 administrative procedures to obtain these federal funds. Before spending any funds
16 appropriated by this Act, the agency or institution shall certify its efforts to the Board
17 of Public Works and state the reason for any failure to obtain federal funds. If federal
18 funds are obtained, they shall be used to defray the costs of the project described in
19 this Act and not to expand its scope.

20 SECTION ~~9.~~ 14. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

21 (a) for any appropriation for the planning of a State-owned project provided in
22 this Act, if a program required by Section 3-602(d) of the State Finance and
23 Procurement Article has not been submitted, the State agency or institution
24 responsible for the project shall submit a program to the Department of Budget and
25 Management for approval before funds may be expended from the appropriation; and

26 (b) for any appropriation for the construction of a State-owned project
27 provided in this Act, if preliminary plans and outline specifications required by
28 Section 3-602(f)(2)(i) of the State Finance and Procurement Article have not been
29 prepared, the State agency or institution responsible for the project shall submit
30 preliminary plans and outline specifications to the Department of Budget and
31 Management for approval before funds may be expended from the appropriation.

32 SECTION ~~10.~~ 15. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That no portion of the
33 proceeds of a loan or any of the matching funds provided for a project funded under
34 this Act may be used for the furtherance of sectarian religious instruction, or in
35 connection with the design, acquisition, construction, or equipping of any building
36 used or to be used as a place of sectarian religious worship or instruction, or in
37 connection with any program or department of divinity for any religious
38 denomination. Upon the request of the Board of Public Works, a recipient of the
39 proceeds of a loan under this Act shall submit evidence satisfactory to the Board that
40 none of the proceeds of the loan or any matching funds has been or is being used for
41 a purpose prohibited by this Act.

 2 may advance funds to any loan funds account established pursuant to a general

 5 that Act, the next ensuing sale of general obligation bonds shall include the issuance
 6 of bonds under the authority of that Act in an amount at least equivalent to the
 7 amount of the funds so advanced.
