22 23	(e) (1) Except as limited by paragraph (2) of this subsection, and only within the boundaries eligible for inclusion in the downtown commercial district authorized by Chapter 604 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1992 and on property controlled by the Department of Recreation and Parks of Baltimore City, a special traffic enforcement officer has the same authority to control and direct pedestrian and
