1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Consent Provisions - Minors - Mental or Emotional Disorder**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing psychologists to give certain individuals information,
 4 without the consent of or over the express objection of a minor, about treatment
 5 of a mental or emotional disorder needed by a minor or provided to a minor
 6 under certain circumstances; authorizing certain individuals, on advice or
 7 direction of a psychologist, to give certain individuals information, without the
 8 consent of or over the express objection of a minor, about treatment of a mental
 9 or emotional disorder needed by a minor or provided to a minor under certain
 10 circumstances; and generally relating to the disclosure of information about the
 11 treatment of a mental or emotional disorder of a minor.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article - Health - General**

21 (a) (1) A minor who is 16 years old or older has the same capacity as an
 22 adult to consent to consultation, diagnosis, and treatment of a mental or emotional
 23 disorder by a physician, psychologist, or a clinic.

1 (2) The capacity of a minor to consent to consultation, diagnosis, and
2 treatment of a mental or emotional disorder by a physician, psychologist, or a clinic
3 under paragraph (1) of this subsection does not include the capacity to refuse
4 consultation, diagnosis, or treatment for a mental or emotional disorder for which a
5 parent, guardian, or custodian of the minor has given consent.

6 (b) Without the consent of or over the express objection of a minor, the
7 attending physician, THE PSYCHOLOGIST, or, on advice or direction of the attending
8 physician OR THE PSYCHOLOGIST, a member of the medical staff of a hospital or
9 public clinic may, but need not, give a parent, guardian, or custodian of the minor or
10 the spouse of the parent information about treatment needed by the minor or
11 provided to the minor under this section.

12 (c) Unless the parent, guardian, or custodian of a minor consents to
13 consultation, diagnosis, or treatment of the minor, the parent, guardian, or custodian
14 is not liable for any costs of the consultation, diagnosis, or treatment of the minor
15 under this section.

16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
17 October 1, 2006.
