1 [(h)] (I) The Board, in accordance with its rules and regulations, shall 2 reinstate the license of an individual who has failed to renew the license for any 3 reason if the individual:

4 (1) Is otherwise entitled to be licensed;

5 (2) Complies with any continuing education requirement established by 6 the Board for this purpose;

7 (3) Pays to the Board a reinstatement fee set by the Board; and

8 (4) Applies to the Board for reinstatement of the license within 5 years 9 after the license expires.

10 [(i)] (J) (1) The Board may not reinstate the license of an electrologist or an 11 electrology instructor who fails to apply for reinstatement of the license within 5 12 years after the license expires.
