SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 2 employee is awarded compensation for less than 75 weeks in a claim arising from

- 4 covered employee compensation that equals one third of the average weekly wage of

- 37 MARYLAND, That:
- 38 (a) The Baltimore City Department of Finance, in consultation with the
- 39 Baltimore City Sheriff's Office, shall conduct a study of the feasibility of providing
- 40 enhanced workers' compensation benefits under § 9-628 of the Labor and
- 41 Employment Article for sworn officers of the Baltimore City Sheriff's Office by

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- 1 including the sworn officers in the definition of "public safety employee" under §
- 2 9-628(a) of the Labor and Employment Article.
- 3 (b) The study shall include:
- 4 (1) a detailed cost estimate; and
- 5 <u>(2)</u> an analysis of the need for enhanced benefits.
- 6 (c) On or before December 1, 2006, the Baltimore City Department of Finance
- 7 shall report to the Baltimore City Senators and the Baltimore City House Delegation
- 8 on the findings of the feasibility study.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 10 October 1, 2006.
