2 Vehicle Laws - Right-of-Way - Penalties for Failure to Yield

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing that, if a person is convicted of failing to yield the
- 4 right-of-way in violation of certain provisions of law and the violation
- 5 contributes to an accident that results in bodily injury to another, the person is
- 6 subject to a certain fine and the Motor Vehicle Administration is required to
- suspend the person's license for a certain period of time; establishing the fine
- and period of license suspension to which a person is subject if the person is
- 9 convicted of failing to yield the right-of-way in violation of certain provisions of
- 10 law and the violation contributes to an accident that results in the death of
- another; providing that the penalties established under this Act are in addition
- 12 to other penalties provided by law; providing that a certain licensee may request
- a certain hearing; and generally relating to penalties for failure to yield the
- 14 right-of-way.

- 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 24 (A) THE PENALTIES FOR FAILURE TO YIELD THE RIGHT-OF-WAY
- 25 ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SECTION ARE IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER PENALTY
- 26 PROVIDED BY LAW.
- 27 (B) IF A PERSON IS CONVICTED OF A VIOLATION UNDER TITLE 21, SUBTITLE 4
- 28 OF THIS ARTICLE AND THE VIOLATION CONTRIBUTES TO AN ACCIDENT THAT
- 29 RESULTS IN BODILY INJURY TO ANOTHER:

- 1 (1) THE PERSON IS SUBJECT TO A FINE OF \$500; AND
- $2 \hspace{1cm} (2) \hspace{1cm} \text{THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL SUSPEND THE PERSON'S LICENSE FOR 3 90 DAYS.}$
- 4 (C) IF A PERSON IS CONVICTED OF A VIOLATION UNDER TITLE 21, SUBTITLE 4 5 OF THIS ARTICLE AND THE VIOLATION CONTRIBUTES TO AN ACCIDENT RESULTING
- 6 IN THE DEATH OF ANOTHER:
- 7 (1) THE PERSON IS SUBJECT TO A FINE OF \$1,000; AND
- 8 (2) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL SUSPEND THE PERSON'S LICENSE FOR 9 180 DAYS.
- 10 (D) SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF TITLE 12, SUBTITLE 2 OF THIS ARTICLE,
- 11 A LICENSEE MAY REQUEST A HEARING ON A SUSPENSION UNDER THIS SECTION.
- 12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 13 October 1, 2006.
