1 (1) wearing a public or private law enforcement or security guard 2 uniform;

3 (2) using an armband; or

4 (3) except as required by law or by regulation adopted by the State Board 5 in connection with ballot security activities, carrying or displaying a gun or badge 6 within 100 feet of a polling site on election day.

7 (b) (1) A law enforcement officer or security guard who is on duty or 8 traveling to or from duty may vote while wearing a uniform.

9 (2) a law enforcement officer who is performing an official governmental 10 function may wear a uniform at a polling site.

11 (c) A person who violates this section is subject to the civil penalty specified 12 under § 16-1002 of this title.

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 14 July 1, 2006.
