A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore County - Community College of Baltimore County - President and**  
3 **Other Positions**

4 FOR the purpose of altering the title of the head of the Community College of  
5 Baltimore County; providing that the President of the Community College of  
6 Baltimore County is responsible for the administration and supervision of the  
7 administrators of the campuses of the community college; authorizing the  
8 President to appoint a vice president, provost, and administrator for the  
9 campuses; providing that the vice presidents, provosts, and administrators of  
10 the campuses report directly to the President; and generally relating to the  
11 Community College of Baltimore County.

12 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,  
13 Article - Education  
14 Section 16-105  
15 Annotated Code of Maryland  
16 (2004 Replacement Volume and 2005 Supplement)

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article - Education**

20 16-105.

21 (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of § 16-104 of this subtitle, the provisions  
22 of this section shall apply only in Baltimore County.

23 (b) There is a Community College of Baltimore County consisting of the  
24 following three campuses:

- 25 (1) The Catonsville Campus;  
26 (2) The Dundalk Campus; and  
27 (3) The Essex Campus.

1 (c) The Board of Trustees for Baltimore County shall appoint a [Chancellor]  
2 PRESIDENT of the Community College of Baltimore County who shall serve at the  
3 pleasure of the Board.

4 (d) The [Chancellor] PRESIDENT:

5 (1) Shall report directly to the Board of Trustees;

6 (2) Shall recommend the appointment by the Board of qualified faculty  
7 members and other employees necessary for the efficient administration of the  
8 Community College of Baltimore County;

9 (3) Shall recommend the discharge of employees for good cause; however,  
10 any employee with tenure shall be given reasonable notice of the grounds for  
11 dismissal and an opportunity to be heard;

12 (4) Is responsible for the administration and supervision of the  
13 [presidents] ADMINISTRATORS, employees, and departments of the campuses of the  
14 Community College of Baltimore County in accordance with the policy manual of the  
15 Community College of Baltimore County as adopted from time to time by the Board of  
16 Trustees; and

17 (5) Shall attend all meetings of the Board, except those involving the  
18 [Chancellor's] PRESIDENT'S personal position.

19 (e) Upon the recommendation of the [Chancellor] PRESIDENT, the Board of  
20 Trustees may appoint a VICE president, PROVOST, AND ADMINISTRATOR of each  
21 campus under its jurisdiction.

22 (f) The VICE presidents, PROVOSTS, AND ADMINISTRATORS of each campus  
23 shall report directly to the [Chancellor] PRESIDENT.

24 (g) Notwithstanding the provisions of § 16-102(a)(2) of this subtitle, the Board  
25 of Trustees may choose the [Chancellor] PRESIDENT to serve as Secretary-Treasurer  
26 of the Board.

27 (h) (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of § 16-103(f)(2) of this subtitle, the  
28 Board of Trustees may, by resolution, authorize the [Chancellor] PRESIDENT to sign  
29 legal documents on behalf of the Board of Trustees including documents related to the  
30 disposition of assets or property of the community college.

31 (2) The resolution may:

32 (i) Authorize the [Chancellor] PRESIDENT to delegate the  
33 authority given to the [Chancellor] PRESIDENT under paragraph (1) of this  
34 subsection to designees that the Board of Trustees considers appropriate; and

35 (ii) Limit the type of legal documents that the [Chancellor]  
36 PRESIDENT may delegate to a designee for signature.

1 (i) Notwithstanding the provisions of § 16-103(m) of this subtitle, the Board  
2 of Trustees shall be styled "the Board of Trustees of the Community College of  
3 Baltimore County".

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
5 July 1, 2006.
