11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

14 8-223.

15 (a) This section applies only in Wicomico County.

16 (b) The Board of License Commissioners may issue a CLASS B [stadium] beer 17 and light wine on-sale (STADIUM) license to the owner of any professional baseball 18 team franchise, whether the franchise is a partnership or a corporation.

19 (c) The license authorizes the holder to sell beer and, if sold with meals, light 20 wine at the stadium:

21 (1) For consumption only on the licensed premises;

22 (2) In plastic, [styrofoam,] STYROFOAM, or paper containers on the 23 stadium premises, except that glass containers may be used in an enclosed dining 24 premises in which the patrons are contadi

1(i)At the baseball game in which the licensee's team is playing; or2(ii)At other events that are held at the stadium; and3(4)During the hours and days for sale specified in § 11-523 of this4 article.1

5 (d) The annual license fee is [\$1,500] \$2,000.

6 (e) Except for a distributor of beer who is conducting business with the 7 licensee for the purposes of this section, the licensee may not permit any person to 8 carry any alcoholic beverages onto or from the licensed premises.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 October 1, 2006.
