### Election Law - Fraudulent Registration and Voting - Penalties

3 FOR the purpose of specifying that a violation of certain criminal laws relating to

- 4 voter registration and voting shall be punished as a felony, rather than a
- 5 misdemeanor; increasing certain fines and terms of imprisonment to which a
- 6 violator will be subject; repealing certain provisions relating to procedures for
- 7 prosecuting a misdemeanor; and generally relating to fraudulent registration
- 8 and voting.

10 CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$50,000 OR IMPRISONMENT
11 FOR NOT MORE THAN 10 YEARS OR BOTH.
