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1	SECTION	1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY O	F
2	MARYLAND.	That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

5 6	(a) The head of the Department is the Secretary of Agriculture, who shall be appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate.
9 10 11 12	(b) The Secretary shall receive the salary provided in the State budget. He serves at the pleasure of the Governor and is responsible directly to the Governor. The Secretary shall counsel and advise the Governor on all matters assigned to the Department of Agriculture and is responsible for carrying out the Governor's policies with respect to these matters. The Secretary shall be responsible for the operation of the Department and shall establish guidelines and procedures to promote the orderly and efficient administration of the Department.
14 15 16	(c) The Secretary, with the approval of the Governor, shall appoint a deputy secretary who has the duties provided by law or delegated by the Secretary. The deputy secretary serves at the pleasure of the Secretary and shall receive the salary provided in the State budget.
18 19	(d) (1) (i) The Secretary also shall have within the Department assistants, professional consultants, and employees as provided in the State budget.
22	(ii) Assistants in charge of areas of responsibility and professional consultants shall be in the executive service, management service, or special appointments in the State Personnel Management System and shall serve at the pleasure of the Secretary.
26	(iii) Wherever it is provided by law that the Secretary makes an appointment to a particular office within the Department with the approval of the Governor, the Secretary may not remove the appointee without first obtaining the Governor's approval.

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1 (b) Except as provided in subsections (c) and (d) of this section, an official or 2 employee may not:
3 (1) be employed by or have a financial interest in:
4 (i) an entity subject to the authority of that official or employee or 5 of the governmental unit with which the official or employee is affiliated; or
6 (ii) an entity that is negotiating or has entered a contract with that 7 governmental unit or an entity that is a subcontractor on a contract with that 8 governmental unit; or
9 (2) hold any other employment relationship if that employment 10 relationship would impair the impartiality and independent judgment of the official 11 or employee.
12 (c) The prohibitions of subsection (b) of this section do not apply:
13 (1) to employment or a financial interest allowed by regulation of the 14 Ethics Commission if:
15 (i) the employment does not create a conflict of interest or the 16 appearance of a conflict of interest; or

 (3) as allowed by regulations adopted by the Commission, to an employee whose government duties are ministerial, if the private employment or financial interest does not create a conflict of interest or the appearance of a conflict of interest; ⁴ for
 (4) to a member of a board who holds the employment or financial interest when appointed if the employment or financial interest is publicly disclosed to the appointing authority, the Ethics Commission, and, if applicable, the Senate of Maryland before Senate confirmation; OR
