## CHAPTER

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## 1 AN ACT concerning

## Maryland Commission for Men Men's Health

3 FOR the purpose of creating the Maryland Commission for Men Men's Health;
4 providing for the appointment of members of the Commission; requiring that 5 certain members of the Commission shall be appointed from among applicants who have been nominated and recommended for appointment by certain organizations; requiring that certain members of the Commission shall be appointed from applicants applying on their own behalf; providing for the terms of the members of the Commission; providing for reimbursement for certain expenses of members; providing that a commissioner who fails to attend a certain number of meetings during a certain time period is considered to have resigned; providing that the Commission is a unit of the Department of Human Resources Health and Mental Hygiene; requiring the members of the Commission to elect a chair and vice chair; requiring the Secretary of Human Resources to appoint an executive director; providing that the executive director is a merit employee of the Department and is entitled to a certain salary; providing for the duties of the Commission; authorizing the Commission to accept certain funds under certain circumstances; requiring the Commission to report annually to the Governor and the General Assembly; defining certain terms; providing for staggered terms for certain members of the Commission; requiring, to the extent practicable, that the appointments to the Commission ensure geographic diversity; requiring the appointments to the Commission to be made without regard to race, color, disability, gender, religion, age, or national origin; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Maryland Commission for Men Men's Health.

8 WHEREAS, This health crisis is of particular concern to men, but is also a 9 concern for women, as the crisis affects fathers, husbands, sons, and brothers; and

WHEREAS, Men's health is likewise a concern for employers, who lose productive employees as well as pay the costs of medical care, and for State government and society, which absorb the enormous costs of premature death and disability, including the costs of caring for dependents left without income; and

WHEREAS, The life expectancy for a child born in Maryland in 2001 was 73.9 5 years for males versus 79.1 years for females; and

16 WHEREAS, The 2001 Maryland death rate of 819.9 per 100,000 population for 17 men exceeded the death rate of 802.4 per 100,000 population for women; and

WHEREAS, In Maryland, only $22 \%$ of the deaths to women in 2001 occurred before age 65 , men younger than 65 accounted for $36 \%$ of all deaths to men in that year; and

WHEREAS, Men comprised 60\% of new HIV cases in 2001 in Maryland and $67 \%$
2 of new AIDS cases in the same year; and
WHEREAS, Men are reported to be $25 \%$ less likely than women to visit a doctor; 4 and

WHEREAS, Employment-based health insurance, which has traditionally 6 financed much of the health care received by men, is on the decline, and recent
27 Medicaid and other publicly-financed health care expansions have focused primarily
28 on children and women; and
29 WHEREAS, Educating men, their families, and health care providers about the 30 importance of early detection of men's health problems can result in reducing rates of 31 mortality for male-specific diseases, as well as improve the health of Maryland men
32 and the State's overall economic well-being; and
33 WHEREAS, Regular exercise, good nutrition, healthy behaviors, regular 34 medical checkups, preventive health screenings, and diagnostic tests that detect 35 disease early have been proven to save lives; and

36 WHEREAS, A Commission for Men Men's Health is needed to promote men's 37 health in Maryland; now, therefore,

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

THE COMMISSION SHALL SUBMIT AN ANNUAL REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, 4 SUBJECT TO § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE GENERAL 5 ASSEMBLY THROUGH THE SECRETARY AND SHALL INCLUDE RECOMMENDATIONS 6 BASED ON ITS STUDIES.

THE COMMISSION SHALL HAVE NO AUTHORITY TO ADOPT RULES AND 9 REGULATIONS.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the terms of the members of the Maryland Commission for Men whose term of office begins on October 1, 2006, shall expire as follows:
(1) in 2008, two members appointed by the Governor, one member appointed by the President of the Senate; and one member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates;
(2) in 2009, one member appointed by the Governor, two members appointed by the President of the Senate, and one member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates; and
(3) in 2010, one member appointed by the Governor, one member 30 appointed by the President of the Senate, and two members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates.

SECTION 3-2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, in making appointments under this Act, the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Delegates shall ensure:

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(1) to the extent practicable, geographic diversity among the

36 membership of the Maryland Commission for Men Men's Health; and

1 (2) that appointments are made without regard to the race, color, 2 disability, gender, religion, age, or national origin of the appointees.

3 SECTION 4. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 4 effect October 1, 2006. It shall remain effective for a period of 4 years and, at the end
5 of September 30, 2010, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this
6 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
