## 1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Vehicle Laws - Bicycles and Motor Scooters - Operation and Equipment

- FOR the purpose of establishing a certain exception to the requirement that a bicycle
- 4 or motor scooter traveling at a certain speed on a certain roadway stay to the
- 5 right side of the roadway; repealing certain provisions of law prohibiting, except
- 6 under certain circumstances, a person from operating a bicycle or motor scooter
- 7 on a roadway where there is a bike lane or a shoulder paved to a smooth surface;
- 8 repealing certain provisions prohibiting a person operating a bicycle or motor
- 9 scooter from leaving the bike lane or shoulder until the movement can be made
- with reasonable safety and until giving an appropriate signal; altering certain
- provisions relating to braking, lighting, and audible equipment for a bicycle or
- motor scooter; clarifying language; and generally relating to the operation of and
- equipment for bicycles and motor scooters on roadways.

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

5	(a) Each person operating a bicycle or a motor scooter at a speed less than the peed of traffic at the time and place and under the conditions then existing on a badway shall ride as near to the right side of the roadway as practicable and safe, xcept when:	
7	(1) Making or attempting to make a left turn;	
8	(2) Operating on a one-way street;	
9	(3) Passing a stopped or slower moving vehicle;	
10	(4) Avoiding pedestrians or road hazards;	
11	(5) The right lane is a right turn only lane; [or]	
12 13	(6) Operating in a lane that is too narrow for a bicycle or motor scooter and another vehicle to travel safely side by side within the lane;	
	(7) THE ROADWAY INCLUDES A BIKE LANE THAT IS NOT ON THE R SIDE OF THE ROADWAY AND THE BICYCLE OR MOTOR SCOOTER IS BEING OPERA' IN THE BIKE LANE.	
17 18	(b) Each person operating a bicycle or a motor scooter on a roadway may ride wo abreast only if the flow of traffic is unimpeded.	
19 20	(c) Each person operating a bicycle or a motor scooter on a roadway shall exercise due care when passing a vehicle.	
21 22	(d) Each person operating a bicycle or a motor scooter on a roadway may walk he bicycle or motor scooter on the right side of a highway if there is no sidewalk.

24 25	(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this title, a person may not ride a bicycle or a motor scooter:	
26 27	(1) On any roadway where the posted maximum speed limit is more than 50 miles an hour; or	
	(2) On any expressway, except on an adjacent bicycle path or way approved by the State Highway Administration, or on any other controlled access nighway signed in accordance with § 21-313 of this title.	
33	(b) [(1) Where there is a bike lane paved to a smooth surface or a shoulder baved to a smooth surface, a person operating a bicycle or a motor scooter shall use the bike lane or shoulder and may not ride on the roadway, except in the following situations:	

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	(i) When overtaking and passing another bicycle, motor scooter, pedestrian, or other vehicle within the bike lane or shoulder if the overtaking and passing cannot be done safely within the bike lane or shoulder;
4 5	(ii) When preparing for a left turn at an intersection or into an alley, private road, or driveway;
6 7	(iii) When reasonably necessary to leave the bike lane or shoulder to avoid debris or other hazardous condition; or
	(iv) When reasonably necessary to leave the bike lane or shoulder because the bike lane or shoulder is overlaid with a right turn lane, merge lane, or other marking that breaks the continuity of the bike lane or shoulder.
	(2) A person operating a bicycle or a motor scooter may not leave a bike lane or shoulder until the movement can be made with reasonable safety and then only after giving an appropriate signal.
	(3) The Department shall promulgate rules and regulations pertaining to this subsection which will include, but not be limited to, a definition of "smooth surface".
17 18	(c)] A motor scooter may not be operated at a speed in excess of 30 miles per hour.
	[(d)] (C) Notwithstanding any other provision of this title, a person may not operate an EPAMD on any roadway where there are sidewalks adjacent to the roadway or the posted maximum speed limit is more than 30 miles an hour.
22 23	[(e)] (D) An EPAMD may not be operated at a speed in excess of 15 miles per hour.

27	(a) (1) If a bicycle or a motor scooter is used on a highway at any time when, due to insufficient light or unfavorable atmospheric conditions, persons and vehicles on the highway are not clearly discernible at a distance of 1,000 feet, the bicycle or motor scooter shall be equipped:
29 30	(i) On the front, with a lamp that emits a white light visible from a distance of at least 500 feet to the front; and
	(ii) On the rear, with a red reflector of a type approved by the Administration and visible from all distances from 600 feet to 100 feet to the rear when directly in front of lawful upper beams of head lamps on a motor vehicle.
36	(2) A bicycle or bicyclist may be equipped with a FUNCTIONING lamp that ACTS AS A REFLECTOR AND emits a red light or a flashing amber light visible from a distance of 500 feet to the rear INSTEAD OF OR in addition to the red reflector required by paragraph (1) of this subsection.

- 9 pavement.
- 10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 11 effect October 1, 2006.
