- 1 (3) A GRANT RECIPIENT SHALL SUBMIT TO THE COUNCIL WRITTEN 2 DOCUMENTATION OF HOW THE GRANT RECIPIENT SPENT OR OTHERWISE USED THE 3 GRANT.
- 4 (H) THE BOARD MAY REALLOCATE MONEY FROM ONE CATEGORY LISTED IN 5 SUBSECTION (F) OF THIS SECTION TO ANOTHER CATEGORY ONLY IF THERE IS A LACK 6 OF SUFFICIENT APPLICATIONS REQUESTING USE OF MONEY IN A PARTICULAR 7 CATEGORY.
- 8 (I) (1) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE COUNCIL SHALL 9 SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE 10 STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.
- 11 (2) THE REPORT SHALL SUMMARIZE THE ACTIVITIES OF THE FUND 12 DURING THE PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR, INCLUDING:
- 13 (I) THE NUMBER OF GRANTS MADE DURING THE FISCAL YEAR;
- 14 (II) THE NAMES OF THE RECIPIENTS OF THE GRANTS;
- 15 (III) THE SPECIFIC PURPOSE OF EACH GRANT AWARDED; AND
- 16 (IV) DOCUMENTATION OF HOW THE GRANT RECIPIENT SPENT OR 17 OTHERWISE USED THE GRANT.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 19 July 1, 2006. It shall remain effective for a period of 14 years and, at the end of June
- 20 30, 2020, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be
- 21 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
