1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2004 - Maryland Independent**
3 **College and University Association - Columbia Union College**

4 FOR the purpose of amending the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2004
5 to authorize the grant to be used for the design and construction of a new music
6 education building; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally
7 relating to the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2004 and Columbia
8 Union College.

9 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
10 Chapter 432 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2004
11 Section 1(3) Item ZA00 (G)

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

18 ZA00 MISCELLANEOUS GRANT PROGRAMS

1 (G) Maryland Independent College and University Association -
 2 Columbia Union College. Provide a grant equal to the lesser of
 3 (i) \$2,250,000 or (ii) the amount of the matching fund provided,
 4 to the Board of Trustees of Columbia Union College to assist in
 5 the design and construction of a new [library] MUSIC
 6 EDUCATION BUILDING, subject to the requirement that the
 7 grantee provide an equal and matching fund for this purpose.
 8 Notwithstanding Section 1(5) of this Act, the matching fund
 9 may consist of funds expended prior to the effective date of this
 10 Act (Montgomery County).....2,250,000

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
 12 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety,
 13 has been passed by a ye and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members
 14 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from
 15 the date it is enacted.
