## 2 Lawyers - Solicitation of Clients - Prohibition on Written Communications

- 19 A LAWYER TO A PROSPECTIVE CLIENT AT THE REQUEST OF THE PROSPECTIVE

- 21 (B) A LAWYER MAY NOT SEND A WRITTEN COMMUNICATION DIRECTLY OR
- 22 THROUGH AN AGENT TO A PROSPECTIVE CLIENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF OBTAINING
- 23 PROFESSIONAL EMPLOYMENT IF THE COMMUNICATION CONCERNS A WORKERS'
- 24 COMPENSATION CLAIM OR OTHERWISE RELATES TO A WORK-RELATED ACCIDENT
- 25 OR DISASTER INVOLVING THE PERSON TO WHOM THE COMMUNICATION IS SENT OR
- 26 THE PERSON'S RELATIVE.
