CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Dorchester County - Water and Sewerage Systems - Benefit Assessments**
3 **and Connection Charges**

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing a sanitary commission in Dorchester County to set
5 reasonable benefit assessments on certain property to pay the cost of capital
6 improvements and repairs to the water or sewerage system; and generally
7 relating to the authority of a sanitary commission in Dorchester County.

8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article - Environment**

16 9-656.

17 (a) (1) To pay the principal and interest on bonds issued under this subtitle,
18 a sanitary commission may set reasonable benefit assessments and reasonable
19 connection charges.

1 (2) In Allegany County, a sanitary commission may also set reasonable
2 benefit assessments to pay the cost of capital improvements to a water or sewerage
3 system.

4 (3) The Sanitary Commission of Worcester County may also set
5 reasonable benefit assessments and reasonable connection charges to pay other costs
6 on bonds issued under this subtitle.

7 (4) IN DORCHESTER COUNTY, A SANITARY COMMISSION MAY ALSO SET
8 REASONABLE BENEFIT ASSESSMENTS TO PAY THE COST OF CAPITAL
9 IMPROVEMENTS AND REPAIRS TO A WATER OR SEWERAGE SYSTEM.

10 (b) (1) Except for Worcester County, a connection charge made under this
11 section shall be equal at least to the cost of making the connection between a water
12 system or sewerage system and the property served by that system.

13 (2) In Worcester County, a connection charge shall be equal at least to:

14 (i) The actual cost of making the connection between a water
15 system or sewerage system and the property served by the system; or

16 (ii) The average cost of making a connection based on:

17 1. The diameter and the length of the connector; or

18 2. The diameter of the connector and the width of the way in
19 which the water pipe or sewer pipe is laid.

20 (3) In the case of connectors constructed under § 9-661 of this subtitle
21 during construction of the water line or sewer line, the Sanitary Commission of
22 Worcester County shall determine a connection charge under paragraph (2)(ii) of this
23 subsection that is the same on each side of the way in which the line is laid.

24 (c) The Sanitary Commission may set benefit assessments on all property,
25 improved or unimproved, that abuts a way in which a water main or sewer has been
26 built.

27 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
28 October 1, 2006.
