Crimes - Obstructing Access to or Expressing Fighting Words at Burial, Memorial Service, Funeral, or Funeral Procession

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from knowingly obstructing, hindering,

- 5 impeding, or blocking another person's entry to or exit from a burial, memorial
- 6 service, funeral, or funeral procession at certain times under certain
- 7 <u>circumstances</u>; prohibiting a person from speaking or displaying visual images
- 8 that convey fighting words within certain distances of an indoor or outdoor
- 9 burial, memorial service, funeral, or funeral procession addressing certain
- 10 speech to a person attending a funeral, burial, memorial service, or funeral
- 11 procession that is likely to incite or produce an imminent breach of the peace;
- 12 prohibiting certain picketing; providing penalties for a violation of this Act;
- 13 defining a certain term; providing for the application of this Act; making the
- 14 provisions of this Act severable; and generally relating to obstructing access to
- 15 and expressing fighting words prohibiting certain speech likely to incite or
- 16 produce an imminent breach of the peace and acts at burials, memorial services,
- 17 funerals, or funeral processions <u>under certain circumstances</u>.

4	WHEREAS, The General Assembly recognizes that the exercise of a person's right to voice their objections to the involvement of the United States in war must be balanced against another person's right to personal safety during a funeral, burial, memorial service, or funeral procession of a person who has served in a war; and
	WHEREAS, Disrupting a funeral, burial, memorial service, or funeral procession in a manner that endangers the health, safety, and welfare of a person is a matter of statewide concern; now, therefore,
9 10	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

	(A) IN THIS SECTION, "FIGHTING WORDS" MEANS WORDS THAT BY THEIR VERY UTTERANCE INFLICT INJURY OR TEND TO INCITE AN IMMEDIATE BREACH OF PEACE, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THE DANGER IS IMMINENT.
16	(B) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO:
17 18	(1) A PERSON WHO HOLDS A VALID LICENSE ISSUED BY THE STATE BOARD OF MORTICIANS; OR

1(2)A PERSON MAY NOT KNOWINGLY OBSTRUCT, HINDER, IMPEDE, OR2BLOCK ANOTHER PERSON'S ENTRY TO OR EXIT FROM A FUNERAL, BURIAL,3MEMORIAL SERVICE, OR FUNERAL PROCESSION.

4 (B) <u>A PERSON MAY NOT ADDRESS SPEECH TO A PERSON ATTENDING A</u>
5 <u>FUNERAL, BURIAL, MEMORIAL SERVICE, OR FUNERAL PROCESSION THAT IS LIKELY</u>
6 <u>TO INCITE OR PRODUCE AN IMMINENT BREACH OF THE PEACE.</u>

7 (C) <u>A PERSON MAY NOT ENGAGE IN PICKETING ACTIVITY WITHIN 100 FEET OF</u>
8 <u>A FUNERAL, BURIAL, MEMORIAL SERVICE, OR FUNERAL PROCESSION THAT IS</u>
9 <u>TARGETED AT ONE OR MORE PERSONS ATTENDING THE FUNERAL, BURIAL,</u>
10 <u>MEMORIAL SERVICE, OR FUNERAL PROCESSION.</u>

(D) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR
AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 90 DAYS OR A
FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$1,000 OR BOTH.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That if any provision of this

15 Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid for any

16 reason in a court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity does not affect other

17 provisions or any other application of this Act which can be given effect without the

18 invalid provision or application, and for this purpose the provisions of this Act are

19 declared severable.

21 effect October 1, 2006.
