1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Task Force on Environmental Health Conditions in Maryland's Classrooms**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Task Force on Environmental Health Conditions in  
 4 Maryland's Classrooms; establishing the membership and staffing of the Task  
 5 Force; providing for the designation of the chair of the Task Force; authorizing  
 6 the Task Force to establish certain subcommittees; requiring the Task Force to  
 7 evaluate and make recommendations regarding certain issues; requiring the  
 8 Task Force to submit a certain report to the Governor and General Assembly by  
 9 a certain date; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain  
 10 compensation, but authorizing a member of the Task Force to receive certain  
 11 reimbursements; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally  
 12 relating to the Task Force on Environmental Health Conditions in Maryland's  
 13 Classrooms.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
 15 MARYLAND, That:

16 (a) There is a Task Force on Environmental Health Conditions in Maryland's  
 17 Classrooms.

18 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:

19 (1) ~~Two members~~ One member of the House of Delegates appointed by  
 20 the Speaker of the House;

- 1                   (2)     ~~Two members~~ One member of the Senate appointed by the President  
2 of the Senate;
- 3                   (3)     The Secretary of the Environment, or the Secretary's designee;
- 4                   (4)     The Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene, or the Secretary's  
5 designee;
- 6                   (5)     The State Superintendent of Schools, or the State Superintendent's  
7 designee; and
- 8                   (6)     The following members jointly appointed by the President of the  
9 Senate and the Speaker of the House of Delegates:
- 10                   (i)      One representative from the Advocates for Children and Youth;
- 11                   (ii)     One representative from the Maryland Committee for Children,  
12 Inc.;
- 13                   (iii)    One representative from the University of Maryland ~~Medical~~  
14 ~~Center's~~ School of Medicine's Division of Pediatric Pulmonology and Allergy;
- 15                   (iv)     One representative from the Johns Hopkins School of Public  
16 Health;
- 17                   (v)      One representative from the American Academy of Pediatrics,  
18 Maryland Chapter; ~~and~~
- 19                   (vi)     One representative from the Maryland Parent-Teacher  
20 Association;
- 21                   (vii)    One representative from the Public School Superintendents  
22 Association of Maryland; and
- 23                   (viii)   One representative from the Maryland Association of Boards of  
24 Education.
- 25           (c)      The members of the Task Force shall elect a chair from among the Task  
26 Force's members.
- 27           (d)      The Task Force may establish subcommittees as it determines necessary to  
28 fulfill its duties.
- 29           (e)      The Department of the Environment and the Department of Health and  
30 Mental Hygiene shall provide staff for the Task Force.
- 31           (f)      A member of the Task Force may not receive compensation for serving on  
32 the Task Force but is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard  
33 State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
- 34           (g)      The Task Force shall:

1                   (1)       Conduct a study of environmental health conditions in all classrooms,  
2 including portable classrooms, throughout the State, that:

3                           (i)       Identifies potentially unhealthy environmental conditions and  
4 their extent within classrooms in the State;

5                           (ii)       Evaluates classroom design and construction specifications,  
6 ventilation systems, school maintenance practices, indoor air quality, and potentially  
7 toxic contamination including mold and other biological contaminants; and

8                           (iii)       Identifies and recommends best practices to prevent harmful  
9 environmental health conditions in classrooms; and

10                   (2)       On or before May 1, 2007, submit a report of its findings and  
11 recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State  
12 Government Article, the General Assembly.

13       SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
14 June 1, 2006. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of May 31,  
15 2007, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be  
16 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
