SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 A Senate Joint Resolution concerning
- 2 Natural Resources State Parks and Forests Preservation and Funding
- 3 FOR the purpose of urging the Governor to direct the Secretary of Natural Resources
- 4 to take steps to ensure that State parks and forests are kept accessible and are
- 5 maintained, to promote certain existing and beneficial programs, and to
- 6 continue to preserve, protect, and fund the State parks and forests.
- WHEREAS, Maryland's State parks provide access to ecological and biological
- 8 diversity, are significant scenic, historical, and cultural assets, and are a fundamental
- 9 element of our State's natural resources; and
- WHEREAS, State parks are part of Maryland's heritage, provide an essential
- 11 public service, satisfy our need to connect with the natural world, give us a sense of
- 12 harmony, and help us better understand the world around us; and
- WHEREAS, Maryland's parks are a treasure to the State and careful
- 14 stewardship of this public trust is critical if future generations are to continue to
- 15 enjoy them; and
- WHEREAS, Our State parks and forests provide an educational resource that is
- 17 over 260,000 acres in size and provide lifelong learning opportunities for all citizens of
- 18 our State; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Maryland State parks are home to a great variety of fish and
- 20 wildlife; and through proper stewardship of these species and their habitats, provide
- 21 hunters and anglers countless opportunities to experience and continue the rich
- 22 traditions of hunting, fishing and wildlife watching; and

- WHEREAS, Parks and forests provide a natural setting and inspiration for
- 2 exercise and activity that improve a person's physical fitness, and therefore help with
- 3 the treatment and prevention of a variety of adult and childhood diseases; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Our State parks play an important role in many sectors of
- 5 Maryland's economy, including tourism industries, recreational activity, retail sectors,
- 6 and employment, to the extent that the economic benefit is tenfold for every \$1
- 7 budgeted for a park, \$10 goes back into the State's economy; and
- 8 WHEREAS, During 2006, the centennial of the Maryland Park and Forest
- 9 Services, more than 12,000,000 visitors are expected to enjoy the natural beauty and
- 10 resources of our parks; and
- WHEREAS, In the current budget, park services are being insufficiently funded
- 12 and provided, in that only six employees are dedicated entirely to interpretive
- 13 services as naturalists and historians, a 66% reduction since 2003, and in 2006, 91
- 14 rangers were transferred to the Natural Resources Police without replacements for all
- 15 of them, and any replacements that are being hired are being funded solely through
- 16 Special Fund revenues, not through General Fund appropriations, which means that
- 17 the money comes out of the park visitor's pocket rather than being funded as a public
- 18 service; and
- WHEREAS, Programs by the Maryland Park Service that provide cultural,
- 20 educational, historical, and recreational resources have been downsized and
- 21 compromised, such as the Junior Ranger program, which will soon be a completely
- 22 self-guided program rather than having park rangers as role models and mentors as
- 23 originally intended; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Compared to other nearby states, Maryland has the highest day
- 25 use and camping service charges, which prevent many people from enjoying this
- 26 public resource; and
- WHEREAS, The Department of Natural Resources has unilaterally changed the
- 28 objective for State parks and now wants to make the parks self-sufficient, generating
- 29 their own revenues through use charges, rather than providing the funds necessary to
- 30 maintain these public lands and public services for all residents of our State to enjoy;
- 31 now, therefore, be it
- 32 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the
- 33 Governor is urged to direct the Secretary of Natural Resources to take steps to ensure
- 34 that Maryland's State parks and forests are kept accessible to all who want to enjoy
- 35 them, to maintain and promote existing and beneficial programs that are important
- 36 historical, educational, and cultural resources in the State, and to continue to
- 37 preserve, protect, and fund State parks and forests fairly, consistently, and in
- 38 perpetuity as a vital public service; and be it further
- 39 RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of
- 40 Legislative Services to the Honorable Robert L. Ehrlich, Jr., Governor of Maryland;
- 41 the Honorable Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., President of the Senate of Maryland; the

- 1 Honorable Michael E. Busch, Speaker of the House of Delegates; and the Honorable2 C. Ronald Franks, Secretary of Natural Resources.
