SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

2 **Lewis and Clark National Historic Trail - Eastward Extension**

3 FOR the purpose of urging the United States Congress to continue to value the
4 importance of the Lewis and Clark Expedition for the country's national
5 heritage, as well as recognize the important role that many eastern states
6 served in preparation for the expedition, by supporting legislation calling for
7 federal approval of an extension of the Lewis and Clark National Historic Trail.

8 WHEREAS, In 1803, President Thomas Jefferson won approval from Congress
9 for a visionary project, formed the expedition's group, the Corps of Discovery, and set
10 the wheels in motion for an endeavor that would become one of America's greatest
11 adventure stories that continues to fascinate people all over the world; and

12 WHEREAS, The Corps of Discovery's journey took them across thousands of
13 miles, where they experienced new lands, rivers, and people that Americans had
14 never encountered before, thus changing the new country's direction; and

15 WHEREAS, One of the permanent members of the Corps of Discovery, Private
16 John Collins, was born in Frederick County, Maryland; and

17 WHEREAS, Before the journey, Captain Lewis traveled through Maryland
18 many times, gathering supplies and making preparations, stopping in Frederick,
19 Maryland, on several occasions on his way to the Harpers Ferry Armory in West
20 Virginia, where the Corps was outfitted with weapons for its western journey, as well
21 as following the Old National Road (US Route 40) from Cumberland, Maryland, on
22 the way to Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania; and

1 WHEREAS, Maryland joins other eastern states in calling for a study on the
2 extension of the Lewis and Clark National Historic Trail to include additional sites
3 associated with the preparation or the return phase of the expedition; and

4 WHEREAS, The Lewis and Clark Trail Heritage Foundation supports
5 recognition of a continuous trail across the country on the National Park Service's
6 official trail map and the right to post the official trail signs that say "Two Captains
7 Pointing the Way" along the entire route; and

8 WHEREAS, The extension of the Lewis and Clark National Historic Trail from
9 coast to coast would complete the story and expose a broader base of Americans to the
10 educational and cultural aspects of the expedition; and

11 WHEREAS, The educational, cultural, and historic assets brought by the Lewis
12 and Clark Trail Heritage Foundation, the National Park Service, the Bureau of Land
13 Management, and the Forest Service, as they partner in caring for the Lewis and
14 Clark National Historic Trail, as well as their support for continued research efforts,
15 are beneficial to all Americans; now, therefore, be it

16 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the
17 General Assembly urges the United States Congress to continue to value the
18 importance of the Lewis and Clark Expedition for the country's national heritage, as
19 well as recognize the important role that many eastern states, including Maryland,
20 served in preparation of the expedition, by supporting legislation calling for federal
21 approval of an extension of the Lewis and Clark National Historic Trail; and be it
