House Bill 750 (Delegate Haynes, et al.)

Health and Government Operations

Health Insurance - Insurance Producers That Sell Medicare Part D Prescription Drug Coverage - Limitations on Sale of Other Insurance

This bill specifies that an insurance producer that sells a Medicare Part D prescription drug policy to an individual may not communicate with the individual by telephone, written communication, e-mail, or any other means for a period of 30 days after the date of the sale for the purpose of selling any other kind of insurance. This prohibition does not apply to a communication made by an insurance producer to an individual at the individual's request.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Monitoring producer activity could be handled with existing Maryland Insurance Administration (MIA) resources. No effect on revenues.

Analysis

Current Law: An insurance producer is a person that, for compensation, solicits, procures, or negotiates insurance contracts. Insurance producers are licensed by MIA and are subject to the unfair trade practices provision of insurance law.
